## Diversity.

Your learning experiences don't stop at the classroom door. They continue in your friendships among the diverse student body. The male-female population is nearly equal. We are 72 percent white, 22 percent black and 6 percent other minority. There are 1,200 foreign students representing many parts of the globe.

We are located in the Cultural Center and our neighbors offer still more opportunities. The Detroit Institute of Arts, International Institute, Detroit Science Center, Center for Creative Studies, main Detroit Public Library and many others are nearby.

The total environment is stimulating, challenging and rewarding. This exciting urban area is also one of the metropolitan area's safest neighborhoods, with a lower overall crimes against people rate than all but a couple of suburbs.

Of America's 2,500 colleges and universities, the Carnegie Commission identified 98 as major (Class
