The junior distance standout turned in a time that buried the competition, stamped out the state meet record and sent Mary Decker down a step from the national ladder.

Matson finished the 1,600-meter run in a record time of 4:39.33, which is 15 seconds faster than the state meet mark of 4:56.5 set by St. Joseph's Kim Arden in 1983. Decker's national best high school time is 4:39.6.

"She said to me right before the race that she felt really good about running," Andover coach Steve Price said, "but there's no way you can anticipate what she did. We've been working really hard on her to run her third lap. She said mentally, she really concentrated on her third lap, and it paid off."

"IT WAS NICE she was able to perform well in front of people and let the county see her."

Price said he has to seek accreditation from the National Track Federation in order for Matson's record time to be official.

"When you have a kid that sets a national record and she's a only a junior, that's scary."

Matson, who will participate at the state meet in three different events, also won the 800 in a meet-record time of 2:12.3. The state meet record is 2:17.0.

Matson's performances helped the Barons finish fourth in the county meet with 35 points. Clarkston overwhelmed the field with 104 points, followed by Pontiac Northern (68) and Southfield (51). Milford placed fifth with 34 points, followed closely by Rochester (33). Troy Athens was next with 20. Bloomfield Hills Lahser scored 18 and Rochester Adams tied Berkley with 16.

Area cagers fall in AAU tourney

The Farmington-Plymouth Saints, a 16-under AAU girls basketball team comprised of players from Farmington Hills, Mercy and Plymouth Salem high schools, fell one game short of the national AAU tournament last weekend.

The Saints, coached by Hank Handley, lost to Detroit Brick City 95-60 in the AAU state finals at Schoolcraft Community College.

The Saints opened the state tournament with a 61-48 victory over Birmingham Friday. Jean Wassenberg (Mercy) led the Saints with 15 points.

Jessica Handley (Salem) and Michelle Fryatt (Mercy) added 11 apiece. On Saturday, the Saints romped on Anchor Bay, 70-46. Mercy's Masi Duczynski scored 25 points. Fryatt and Handley contributed 12 each.

The tables were turned on the Saints in the title game Sunday. A small but lightning quick Detroit team blew the Saints away. Duczynski scored 19 and Fryatt 14 for the losers.

Detroit will represent Michigan in the AAU nationals June 28-July 6 in Fairfax, Va.



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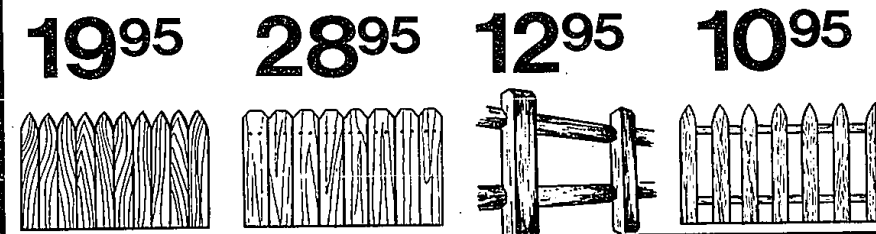
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
