In addition to those capital needs items, an amount was given to each school for building needs to be determined by each school's administrators. Each elementary school will receive \$4,000, each middle school \$3,000 and each high school \$4,000.

Specific capital needs items approved last week by school board members include cafeteria tables, doors and one frames, playground equipment and sidewalks for elementary schools. The total amount of expenditures for the 1.6 ementary schools will receive a total of \$43,907 to pay for such items as lockers, tables and a bot water heat-collectic high schools will get such

Other capital needs expenditures include: \$21,000 for high school and middle school scoreboards, \$33,000 for four maintenance vehicles and \$22,500 for carpeting for the central office.

CAPITAL NEEDS expenditures over \$3,000 must be approved by the school board members before the im-provements or additions may be pur-chased, Howell said.

There were some unapproved capital needs requests for 1985-86 such as tile for Becchview, new building playground equipment for William Grace Elementary and two computers for Harrison High.

"Many of these can be purchased by each building from their individual building funds," Howell said.

The capital needs committee was unable to accommodate funding of six major requests including paving the East Middle School parking lot, refinishing the paneling at Gill School, de-

writers and new pipes. The total amount of expenditures for the three schools comes to \$347,437.

"Capital improvements are more construction items," said Howeil.

The capital improvements account is funded with money derived from the sale of school properties. Money ac-quired from the sale of school proper-ties cannot be put back into the general fund of the budget, Howell said. It can, however, be used to construct or im-prove current structures.
