INSTRUCTIONAL SPORTS CAMP — Instructional Sports Camp will again be offered this summer by the Farmington Hills Parks and Recreation and Oakland Community College. The camps will be held during the summer of 1985 at the Orchard Ridge

Campus in Farmington Hills. The purpose of the Instructional Sports Camp will be to provide a personal approach to the development of skills and techniques particular to each sport. Camp enrollment will be geared to a small student to instructor ratio, and will be available for both boys and girls of middle and high school age. Each individual will receive instruction in a natural progression suited to their needs.

The camps will be offered on a one week basis meeting Monday through Friday for a total of 17.5 instructional hours a week at a cost of \$45 per camp, beginning the week of June 17. If you

YOUTH SWIM LESSONS — Swimming instruction for beginner to advanced skill levels will be offered at Farmington and North Farmington High School. Each two-week session consists of daily classes which meet Monday through Thursday, Session 1, June 24-July 3. Fee is \$18. All children must be 38-inches at the chin in order to participate in swim lessons.

RECREATION OPEN SWIMMING — Individuals can enjoy recreational

swimming 1-4 p.m. Monday through Thursday at Farmington and North Farmington High Schools and will continue through August 1. The fee is \$1 per person. Open swimming requires that all children must be accompanied by an adult if their chin height is below 38 inches.

COM-ON-WONNA-CAMP — Our day camp is designed for children 6-12 years of age and provides both educational and recreational programs. Campers will be involved in animal and insect study, fishing, archery, field trips and more. The camp is located at Oakland Community College, Orchard

Ridge Campus. Camp runs five days a week. Registration fee is \$32.

JUNIOR GOLF LEAGUE — Boys and girls ages 12-16 can participate in a seven match league schedule. League play will be on Mondays and Fridays beginning Monday, July 8. League members will also be eligible to participate in the Northwest Parks and Recreation golf tournament. Players will be arranged by the following age divisions: boys 12-14 and 15-16, girls 12-14 and 15-16. A first come-first served registration will be held with a deadline of Friday, June 28. Registration fee is \$26 and includes all green fees.

SOFTBALL, FOUNDER'S FESTIVAL TOURNAMENT/FALL LEAGUE MEETING — Informative meetings will be held at 7 p.m. for adult fall softball leagues and at 8 p.m. for the men's Founder's Festival Softball Tournament on Thursday, June 27, at the Farmington Hills Library, 32737 W. 12 Mile. Pertinent information as entry fees, registration deadlines and residency requirements will be discussed.

SUMMER FUN CENTERS — We have opened seven community playground sites that will run through Aug. 1. Supervised activities will include a variety of games, sports, arts and crafts and special events. All activities will include boys and girls 6-13 years of age (children must have completed first grade). The morning sites will be

Kenbrook, Forest, Longacre and Wooddale Elementary Schools from 9:30 a.m. to noon. The afternoon sites are Flanders, William Grace and Larkshire Elementary Schools 1-3 p.m. There is no fee for this activity.

Oakland's roads

— 2,500 miles

More than half of all highways, roads and streets in Oakland are county roads. That means they are under jurisdiction of the county Road Commission. Totalling more than 2,500 miles, the Oakland County road system includes all public roads in townships and through streets in most cities and villages. It is the longest county system in Michigan.

Its subdivision streets alone (all in townships) make up more than 1,000 miles or the equivalent of a trip from Pontiac to Florida.

About half of the system is paved. More than half is within the county's urban area, where some roads are four and five feet wide to handle heavy traffic. A single intersection, in Southfield, is the meeting place for 100,000 vehicles daily. More than 800 electrical signals and 35,000 signs are in use in the county road system.
