A surprise service of thanksgiving, a round of testimonials and gifts, and a luncheon for members and friends marked the silver anniversary of the installation of Charles Fox, pastor at St. John American Lutheran Church in Farmington, on Sunday, June 16.

The Rev. William Wolfe, a former Livonia pastor and longtime friend, was the keynote speaker.

Out-of-town guests included: Fox's mother and mother-in-law from Toledo; his daughter, Brenda Fox Lampe-

la, and granddaughter, Heidi, from Virginia Beach, Va.; son and daughter-in-law Mark and Denise Fox of Greenville, S.C.; and grandson Charles Mark Fox.

The couple's youngest daughter, Bethany, helped plan the celebration.

Fox and his wife received a gift of cash to be used for a trip next summer. Other gifts included an engraved gold watch from the St. John choir and rededication of the pastor's office.

The pastor, a native of Toledo, attended Capital University and Capital Theological Seminary in Columbus, Ohio. After a brief pastorate in Ada, Mich., he was called to St. John in Farmington in 1969, preaching his first sermon there on June 16, 1969, as the church's second pastor. St. John celebrated its own silver anniversary in 1983.

Fox's wife, Barbara, is an elementary school teacher in the Farmington Community Schools.

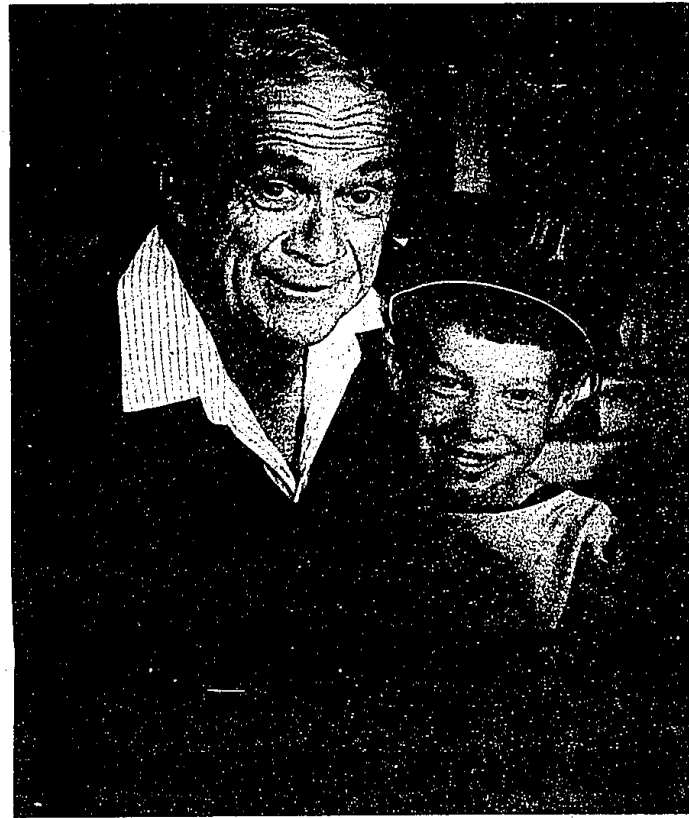
Institute's officers are elected

Ballots may be picked up at either branch of the Farmington Community Library from now until Aug. 8.

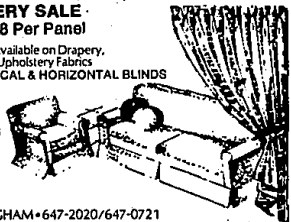
