## Child's play for adults

Photographing children can seem more like child's play if you follow a few helpful tips from experts:

- **Composition** — Look before you shoot. Get close enough to the child to fill the frame. Then, determine whether a horizontal or vertical format will be best to fill the frame. Plan the background to eliminate distractions and photograph the child from his own eye level. Place the child off center and don't be

afraid to experiment.

- **The right equipment** can help you to be more creative. Today, there are compact 35-mm cameras that are easy to use and small enough to take anywhere.
- **Keep your camera ready.** If children are accustomed to seeing you with a camera, they'll act more naturally. Candid shots are fun. Involve the children in an activity to "anchor" them . . . and take lots of pictures.

## Research grants given for diet-cancer link

Almost \$500,000 for scientific research into the diet, nutrition and cancer relationship has been approved by the American Institute for Cancer Research (AICR).

"We're very excited by the possibilities many of these new studies may offer for furthering knowledge about cancer and its relationship to diet and nutrition," said Dr. Colin Campbell, professor of nutritional biochemistry at Cornell University and chairman of the AICR Grant Review Panel.

The new AICR grants approach the cancer problem from a variety of nutritional concerns.

A study to be conducted by Howard L. Hostet at Washington State University will examine the effects of dietary fat on the growth of breast tumors.

In a second study concerning dietary fats, Selwyn A. Brothman, at the Boston University School of Medicine, will examine the effect of various types of fats on the growth and spread of colon cancer.

AICR will also be funding a research study at the Cleveland Clinic where researcher Arthur Flynn will examine the effectiveness of selenium in increasing the body's defenses in patients known to be facing a higher than usual cancer risk.

Developing a nutritional program that will aid in slowing down or halting tumor growth for cancer patients is the aim of an AICR funded study at the University of California, San Diego.

Robert H. Hoffman will be attempting to develop a nutritional program for cancer patients that will provide adequate nutrition, but will deprive cancerous cells of an amino acid normally required by cancer tumors for growth.

IN ADDITION to these new research grants, AICR also approved continuation grants for several other scientific research programs begun earlier.

These include an epidemiological study on diet and cancer at the Massachusetts Institute of Technology, a study of nutrition and breast cancer in Ireland, a study of hormones and diet in women at high risk for breast cancer and a study on dietary factors in cancer etiology in China.
