

Livonia Adray climbs back into 1st place

The Livonia Collegiate Baseball League (LCBL) has a new leader — Adray.

Livonia Adray, last year's playoff champ, moved back into first place after the weekend by whipping Westland Federation in a double-header at Ford Field, 7-0 and 5-1.

Adray (17-4), managed by Ron Heller, is a half-game up on Redford Little Caesars (17-5) and one game ahead of Walter's Appliances (16-5), which has held the lead most of the season.

In the first game, right-hander Rick Roman tossed a four-hitter, besting Westland starter Mark Perdue.

Adray broke the game open in the fourth inning, scoring four runs. Mike

Johnson keyed the surge with a two-run double.

Dave Austin and Bill Uile added two hits and one RBI each for the winners.

In the second game, pitcher Todd Krutznick picked up his fifth victory of the year, fanning 10 and allowing just four hits.

Austin, Deron White and Doug Kaiser each collected two hits. White also drove in two runs.

Redford swept a double-header Sunday from the last place Angels, 3-1 (in 12 innings) and 10-0 (five innings).

Tom Liss, the winning pitcher in the first game, went the distance, striking out 14 and allowing just four hits.

Bob Copelan went all 12 innings in a

losing cause.

Singles by Dan Michaels and Mike Hodge, followed by a sacrifice fly by Ken Krill and an error accounted for two Caesars runs in the 13th.

Hodge also belted a homer in the fifth to knot the count at 1-1. Gary Litzenich went three-for-five with two stolen bases.

Rich Popp had two hits for the Angels, including a run-scoring triple.

In the second game, Deron Armstrong pitched a perfect game as Caesars used the 10-run mercy rule to beat the Angels, 10-0.

Armstrong fanned six of the 15 batters he faced, raising his record to 2-1.

Litzenich and Don Taylor paced the Redford offense with two hits and two RBIs apiece.

WALTER's edged Northville Sunday in a makeup game at Northville High School, 4-3, as Bob Foster knocked the game-winning run with a single in the third inning.

Foster, Steve Frellick and Gary Hall each contributed two hits for the winners.

George Clark went three-for-three in a losing cause.

John Fraser, the winning pitcher, scattered eight hits and fanned six in going the distance.

He bested Northville starter and loser Greg Ryba, who gave up nine hits over six innings.

Northville, behind the three-hit pitching of Dan Zang, moved into fourth place Sunday with a 5-1 victory over Garden City at Ford Field.

A two-run single by Scott Swietockowski and a suicide squeeze bunt by Chris Hauser keyed a three-run

Northville outburst in the second inning.

NORTHVILLE scored two more in the fourth on an RBI single by Zac Chidress, who later scored on two wild pitches from GC starter and lower Gary Hackett, who fanned eight and walked only one in going the distance.

Earlier in the week, Northville beat Westland, 10-2, as Scott Draper and Tom Gatter hit three hits each, enabling pitcher Chris Willner to pick up the victory.

CITY OF FARMINGTON HILLS SUMMARY OF PROCEEDINGS REGULAR CITY COUNCIL MEETING July 8, 1985

Mayor Dolan opened the regular meeting of the Farmington Hills City Council on July 8, 1985 at 7:30 p.m. Members present: Alkateb, Dolan, Dodley, Marks, Sorocan, Williams and Wolf. Others present: City Manager Costick, City Clerk Reynolds and City Attorney Bibace.

Minutes of June 17, 1985 were approved as presented and minutes of June 24 will be reconfirmed.

Council approved Supplemental Roll for road improvement on Hathaway, Special Assessment District C-185-A.

Council enacted Ordinance C-49-85, Zoning Request 8-2-85, to rezone Lot 29 of Assessor's Rickland State Subdivision from RA-4 to P-1.

Council approved a Patio Permit for Farmington Hills on July 11, 1985.

Council approved Fireworks Display Permit for R. Megraw for Founders Festival (Presented by) Saturday, July 20, 1985 at Oakland Community College.

Council approved Country Fair Permit for St. Vincent and Sarah Fisher Center for August 17 and 18, 1985.

Council approved various Product changes and additions.

Mayor Dolan and Mayor Pro Tem Alkateb were appointed delegates and alternate to Michigan Municipal League Annual Convention on September 11-15, 1985.

D. Keith Dodson was appointed to Zoning Board of Appeals.

An executive session will be held immediately following the council meeting to discuss labor negotiations and agreements and city manager's contract.

Council awarded contract to Reno Mainstreet & Sons, Inc. in the amount of \$181,574.64, S&D C-183, for Hathaway Road Paving Project in Section 18.

Council approved sidewalk waiver for Diamond Automobile Company.

Council approved sidewalk waiver for Yow Athletic Development.

Council awarded contract to Bogetta Company, Inc. in the amount of \$79,825 S&D C-184, for Alameda Drive watermain.

Council awarded contract to Bogetta Company, Inc. in the amount of \$34,630 for watermain installation along Eight Mile Road.

Council awarded contract to Jones Construction Company for watermain installation along Village Lane and approved a payback agreement with the owners of Lots 179 through 178 and Lots 15 and 13 on Wellington in Section 15.

Council approved City's participation in Walnut Hills sanitary sewer interceptor improvement project.

Council approved purchase order to A.B.C. Harley-Davidson of Pontiac for two new replacement motorcycles for Police Department in amount of \$14,000.

Traffic Control Order 82-95-1985 was adopted setting speed limit on Inkster Road for north and southbound traffic between 18 Mile and 14 Mile Road at 30 mph.

Council authorized City Manager to solicit proposals from telephone/communication systems companies.

Council introduced Ordinance authorizing a conveyance of City property, Parcel No. 23-15-364-060.

City's hearing date was set for Liberty Street Vacation on August 24, 1985.

CITY OF FARMINGTON COUNCIL PROCEEDINGS (Summary)

A regular meeting of the Farmington City Council was called to order by Mayor Yoder at 8:00 p.m., July 1, 1985, in Council Chambers, 23600 Liberty Street, Farmington, Michigan.

PRESENT: Bennett, Hartsock, Tupper, Walker, Yoder.

OTHERS PRESENT: City Manager Deadman, Assistant Director Gushman, Director Lashoff, Deputy Director Cox, City Attorney Kelly, City Clerk Busby.

Minutes of previous meeting were approved.

Minutes of other boards were received and/or filed.

Council received for study Mrs. Britton's letter proposing regulation of use of alcohol and substance use at open house parties, and instructed that she be advised that Farmington's ordinances are presently adequate in this regard.

Council received a letter concerning the public facilities in City Park, and instructed that the writer receive a reply.

Council received notice from the Michigan Liquor Control Commission concerning the transfer of a 1985 S&D liquor license at the Short Stop on Grand River.

Council approved a sign variance for Thibault Enterprises, Inc., at 33214 Grand River.

Council authorized a contract with the City Engineers to provide design, administration and layout services for the 1985 Sluiceway Park Improvement Project.

Council authorized continued participation in the Senior Citizen Dial-A-Ride contract with D&M.

Council accepted the low bid of Grimes Cleaners at \$4,083.44 for the Public Safety Department's uniform cleaning.

Council called for enforcement of the vehicles on public right-of-way section of the Uniform Traffic Code dealing with motor vehicles for sale on public property.

Council authorized Attorney Hampton to defend the city in the Acme Ball Bonds vs. Farmington Police Department lawsuit.

Council adopted the following resolutions:

- Requesting Oakland County to prepare a proposal for the purpose of performing an I-96 Corridor Study;
- Authorizing applications for Michigan Youth Corps summer project workers.

A tour prior to the meeting on road problems in Chatham Hills Subdivision resulted in Council instructing the City Manager to meet with the Homeowners' Association in the hope of developing a Special Assessment District to solve the road and edge drain problems.

Council received General Fund and 47th District Court Financial Reports for the eleven months ended May 31, 1985.

Monthly bills were approved for payment.

Meeting adjourned at 9:50 p.m.
