Ensemble is back for another summer theater performance

Farmington Area Theatre Ensemble, made up of Farmington High School graduates who enjoy staging productions, are back for the fourth consecutive summer to bring "A Taste of Farmington" at 7:30 p.m. Wednesday, July 24 in Farmington Branch Library, State and Liberty. Admission is free.

The ensemble got under way when about a dozen '82 graduating seniors who had worked well together in high school plays were going to be leaving town for about that many colleges. The group produced its own summer play just to work one last time together.

But summer vacations continued to bring the group back together for productions, generally during Founders Festival days, and each summer there was enough audience response to encourage them to do it one more time.

"We don't have a director this year," said Jeannine Bergers. "The entire production is a collective effort, directing, producing, lights, sets, props, the selection of the material, publicity, everything. Craig Hane (who directed several plays for Farmington High and pulled the original actors together for the ensemble) is doing theater work at U-M and couldn't get away so we're directing and critiquing one another."

"A TASTE OF Farmington" is a collection of 20th-century humor and drama. The production is scheduled to run for about 60 minutes and includes skits from James Thurber, Jules Feiffer, Edgar Lee Masters' "Spoon River Anthology," Carol Burnett's "Fireside Girl" and "The Owl and The Pussycat."

This year's players, some original members and others who graduated in 1983 or 1984 are, in addition to Bergers, Phil Lynch, Kathy McRae, Chris McRae, Jane Neuhauser, Andy Young and Don Schroeder. Rehearsals follow the same format

as in former years, "In basements, in back yards, wherever there's room for us," said Neuhauser who has been with the ensemble for four years and numbers the fact that the group couldn't rehearse on the stage where the show will be produced as their only concern.

Rehearsals caused another bit of a problem "With seven people, seven jobs and seven shifts," Bergers added.

Money to produce the show and offer it free not a concern.

"We asked a few businessmen in town to sponsor us, and they were very receptive," Neuhauser said. "They accepted our request for what it is: a small town effort to offer a night of summer theater."

Neuhauser described the show as "Colorful. A lot of variety for a mixed audience with ever-changing sets."
