Ditzhary said she was also amazed at the fine quality of goods sold by locals for "next to nothing."
"Everything is less there," she said. "To us (Americans), who have more it seems like such a little amount because we have so much."
The school board member was also impressed with the willingness to change.
"There is a dynamic atmoshpere of change in China." Ditzhary said.
"Things will change in China and change well rapidly have in the past few years."

THE CONTRAST BETWEEN China and Russia was not as great as Ditzhary anticipated.
"I was expecting a feeling of being constantly watched, but I didn't feel

that at all," Dithary said of the group's visit to Moscow and LeninGenerally, she said, the attitude of the Russian people depend on what U.S.-Russian relations are at the time. "When we were over there (in Russia), President Reagan was talking about a summit with the Russian leaders, so the attitude toward Americans was favorable," she said "Russian people hear a lot of propaformation while there but usually canot bring it back into Russia."

The opposite is also true, she said.

"In this instance someone from another country can visit, bring books with them and then, incidentally, leave them in the house," Dithary said.

The government still restricts the travels of Russians for fear of another revolution, she said.
"They (the Russian government), are afraid to let their people go out of Russian and China.
