

TV production keeps many busy

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"There's always a spot for them in community programming. It's so important for people to know it's available to them."

Community access includes providing a forum for some ideas that are less-than-popular.

"That's their choice. It's freedom of speech," she said. "No way do we make judgments. We're not allowed to do that, absolutely not."

One talk show, "Insight," deals with some controversial issues, she said. The show's producer is John Virley, with Fred Lichtman serving as host.

"They work very hard at getting a balance," Samouellian said. "They've been very successful."

Topics dealt with on the show have ranged from capital punishment to mandatory seat belt laws.

"Sultcase studio" TV equipment is also housed at each city hall, and is used to record government programming.

Besides giving residents a chance to get involved with television, it also aids students who wish to someday become professionals.

Hans Borger, a 21-year-old senior majoring in broadcasting at Central Michigan University is one of those students.

"We live up north in Roscommon," said Borger. "My grandparents live here, and we used to live in Southfield." He chose the Detroit area for his internship "because up north there's really nothing in the way of internships."

Monday afternoon, Borger was preparing for the taping of his show, "Music for Dining."

"It's based on a record album cover of the '50s, so that's what we're trying to recreate here, a '50s look. It's music of the '40s and '50s."

The show was taped Monday night.

"They schedule programs one or two weeks ahead, so it won't be on for a couple of weeks anyway," Borger said.

Borger's "Music for Dining" show includes as cast members Borger and Samouellian. Other cast members are Judy Grosse, Tom Scuto, and Judy Antish.

"IT'S THE first time we have explored programming that is using more of a creative venture," Samouellian said.

Samouellian's job includes making community residents aware of the opportunities to get involved in cable TV programming, as Borger has done with his "Music for Dining" show.

Farmington, Farmington Hills and North John entered into the franchise agreement with Metrovision to provide cable TV services to residents of the three cities.

"Gerontology Management," Thursday evenings.

A workshop, "Gerontology Today," which consists of a series of lectures on aging issues in today's society, will be held on four Friday afternoons, beginning Sept. 27.

Chairwoman of the gerontology department, Kathy Needham, who is also a state commissioner for services to the aging, will be instructing three courses: "Issues in Aging" from 1 to 4 p.m. Tuesdays; "Social Gerontology" 7-10 p.m. Mondays and "Public Policy and Resources in Aging" 7-10 p.m. Wednesdays.
