

Two charged in break-in

Two Redford Township residents were arraigned last Wednesday before Judge Michael Hand of the 47th District Court on charges of breaking and

entering an occupied dwelling. Marylyne Jane Zemko, 17, was released on a \$10,000 personal bond. David Doyle Dupuis, 20, was released on a \$10,000 cash or surety bond. A pre-exam conference was set for Monday. "That's a 19-year felony," said

Farmington Hills Police Chief William Dwyer. The property recovered, including cash and jewelry items, was estimated to be worth \$1,100. The arrests followed a reported breaking and entering at approximately 2:30 a.m. last Tuesday. Officers began to enter the area near 26347 Greythorne, in the vicinity of the 11 Mile-Middlebelt intersection.

"As the officers began to enter the subdivision on Greythorne, Officer (Alan) Soderlund from S.P.O.T. (Special Patrol Operational Team) observed a car leaving with two occupants," Dwyer said. Soderlund was in an unmarked car and was wearing plainclothes. "He immediately requested a marked unit to assist him in stopping the vehicle. He obviously was very alert. I certainly feel that Soderlund did an excellent job." Officers from the vehicle that responded to the Greythorne address reported that cash and jewelry items had been taken, Dwyer said.

Arrest follows theft from car

A Keego Harbor resident was arrested in Farmington Hills at approximately 1 a.m. last Wednesday when suspected drugs were found in his possession. He has been charged with possession of a controlled substance (cocaine).

William Tracey, 29, was arraigned last Wednesday before Judge Margaret Schaefer of the 47th District Court. He posted a \$500 bond and was released. A pre-exam conference was set for Tuesday.

Tracey's car was parked in a lot at 14 Mile and Orchard Lake roads by Max & Ernie's restaurant. "Police saw three local juveniles break the car's window and remove a radar detector, said Lt. Ernie Miller of the Farmington Hills Police Department. The juveniles had first been spotted by police near the Twelfth Estate Condominiums, on 12 Mile Road between Orchard Lake and Middlebelt roads.

"Originally, he was arrested on the two misdemeanor warrants, and then some of the drugs were found during the search at the station," said Police Chief William Dwyer.

Tables in a plastic bag were also found, the lieutenant said. "They're at the State Police lab." In addition to analysis of the tablets, the laboratory will also do a more detailed analysis of the suspected cocaine, Miller said.

THE SUSPECTED drugs were sent to the Michigan State Police crime lab "for an analysis, which is standard procedure," Dwyer said. The vial of suspected cocaine was found on the suspect, Miller said, "when they were processing him at the station. Preliminary tests showed it to be cocaine."

AFTER THE car at the restaurant was broken into, the juveniles were stopped by police at 14 Mile and Farmington roads. "They would have been turned over

to their parents," said Miller, who heads the police department's detective division. They'll be processed through the Probate Court. "Papers were found inside the car identifying the owner, Miller said. The car's owner was found to have outstanding misdemeanor warrants.
