The question they ask is, "What should we do with the money?" It is not easy to answer that question, because there are many tax and other considerations that must be taken into account. In this article, we would only discuss how much the IRS will get from the money you just received. That, incidentally, will depend on what you do.
When you decide to spend the money, say, on a new business or a home, you can get a big tax break under the IRS'
"Ten-year Averaging Rule." To qualify, you have to meet these four conditions:

You receive the money from a

qualified pension or profit-sharing plan.

The entire balance in your retirement plan account must be paid out in on year.

You must have been covered by the plan for at least five years.

You receive the money because you have left your job, reached age 59-16, or become disabled.

HOW IT WORKS. The tax you pay under the 10-year averaging rule depends on the amount you receive — not your current income or tax bracket. When you follow the special IRS formula, you will end up paying about a 14.73 percent tax on a \$100,000 distribution and 27 percent on a \$400,000 distribution.

TO SPEND or not to spend. When you receive a large distribution and you do not expect to retire for many years, it would be prudent for you to defer tax on the whole amount with a rollover.

You have 60 days to put the money into an IRA account — if you miss the limit, you are out of luck. So when you are not sure, go for the IRA. You can take the money out before the end of

HALF-AND-HALF. Can you use the 10-year averaging rule to figure the tax on part of the money and roll over the balance into an IRA? No. When you take part in cash, that amount is taxed at ordinary income rates. But the amount placed in the IRA is sheltered from current tax.

ROLLING OVER. When you decide

Rolled-over distributions can be put into more than one account. You can put some money into a hank IRA and direct that the canh be used to buy a certificate of deposit. You can put the balance into your money market IRA.


