PUNT, PASS AND KICK — The Recreation Division will be sponsoring a punt, pass and kick competition for children ages 8-13 in the Farmington area. The event will be held on Saturday, Sept. 28. Children ages 8 and 9 will compete at 9 a.m.; ages 10 and 11 at 9:30 a.m. and ages 12 and 13 at 10 a.m. Awards will be presented to the first-, second- and third-place finishers in each division with each winner advancing to the regional competition. There is no registration fee, but pre-registra-

tion is required at the Parks and Recreation office.

YOUTH SWIM LESSONS — Swimming instructions for beginner to advanced skill levels will be offered at North Farmington High School. The eight-week session will be held on Saturdays beginning Sept. 28, concluding Nov. 16. Children must be 88 inches in height at their chin in order to participate. Pre-registration fee of \$20 is required.

YOUTH BOWLING LESSONS — The Recreation Division, in cooperation with Bel-Aire, Country and Northwest Lanes, will offer a competitive approach, ball delivery, timing and scoring lessons. Classes will begin 4:50 p.m. the week of Sept. 30. The fee is \$15 with registration at the Parks & Recreation office, or use the information flyers that will be distributed through the Farmington area schools.

ICE SKATING LESSONS — Learn to ice skate or improve your skating techniques if you are a beginner or an advanced skater. Classes meet for 30 minutes once a week for six weeks beginning the week of Sept. 23 at 3:30 p.m. for children and 7:30 p.m. and 8 p.m. for adults. Rental skates are available. All lessons will be held at the Beech Woods Arena and the class fee is \$25.

CITY OF FARMINGTON HILLS SUMMARY OF PROCEEDINGS REGULAR PUBLIC HEARING SEPTEMBER 16, 1985

Mayor Dolan opened the public hearing meeting of the Farmington Hills City Council on September 16, 1985 at 7:30 p.m. Members present: Alkateeb, Donal, Dudley, Soronen and Williams. Members absent: Marks and Wolf. Others present: City Manager and several introduced Zoning Map Amendment, Planning Consultant Coates, Costick, City Clerk Reynolds, City Attorney Ribicau, and Planning Consultant Coates.

Council introduced Zoning Map Amendment, Zoning Request 32-5-85, in the NW ¼ of Section 3, on the south side of Fourteen Mile, east of Farmington Road, from RA-1 to OS-1, with the exception of the west 50 ft. of the north 200.55 ft. of Lot 1, which will remain RA-1.

Council denied Introduction of Zoning Map Amendment, Zoning Request 26-5-85, in the SE ¼ of Section 34, on the east side of Osmun, between Junction and Eight Mile Road from RA-3 to RC-3.

Council introduced Zoning Map Amendment, Zoning Request 32-5-85, in the NW ¼ of Section 3, on the south side of Fourteen Mile, east of Farmington Road, from RA-1 to OS-1, with the exception of the west 50 ft. of the north 200.55 ft. of Lot 1, which will remain RA-1.

Council introduced Zoning Map Amendment, Zoning Request 33-7-85, in the NW ¼ of Section 2, on the south side of Rexwood, east of Orchard Lake Road, from RA-4 to OS-1.

Council introduced Zoning Map Amendment, Zoning Request 31-6-85, in the NE ¼ of Section 33, on the south side of Nine Mile, west of Gill Road, from RA-3 to RP-2. Resolution No. 3 (Necessity Resolution) was adopted for sanitary sewers on Ten Mile Road from Briarhill to Inkster Road in Section 24 and Resolution No. 4 was adopted, setting the date of the cost hearing for October 31, 1985.

Amendment to Wellington Office Center Consent Judgment was approved.

Variance of Chapter 61 of the City Code for Hunters Point North Subdivision was approved.

Kay Zolton was appointed to the Housing Commission for a three year term to expire February 1, 1988.

Consideration of Executive Session to discuss pending litigation and land acquisition was adjourned for one week.

Council approved the Final Plat for Strathmore Subdivision in Section 7.

Council adopted resolution approving a three-year waiver for sidewalk requirement along Twelve Mile Road for the Griswold Building in Section 18.

Council adopted resolution allocating the transfer of \$6,500 from unappropriated surplus of the General Fund to maintain current level of service for the Home Chore Program for the 1985/86 budget year.

Adoption of a Resolution authorizing acceptance of bid proposals for installation of the Softball Field lighting system at Harrison High School was deleted from agenda. Meeting adjourned at 11:10 p.m.

Two students from the Farmington area were among a campus study group of 24 that attended the 57th annual International Congress of the Societe Internationale Enseignement Commercial (SIEC) in Merano, Italy.
