
signed architecture. They look as if they belong, never jarring, never harsh, but rather forming an investing time-dimensional profile.

Bittle Duvall has expanded upon the contemporary designs that she once used on her functional plates and cups. Her ceramic and wood wall pieces, sculptural interpretation of those designs, work well and show how good design can be adapted to more than one size and increased dimensions.

Both Duvalis use planes of color with a kind of quiet authority. They know what they're doing.
