

Trustees seek improved public relations

ANOTHER CHANGE will be the addition of a public comment and question portion on the meeting's agenda, Vagnozzi said. Although the meeting begins at 5 p.m., the public comment portion will be later in the meeting, at about 6:30 to 7 p.m.

A method for allowing the public to comment on specific agenda items under discussion is still being developed, Vagnozzi said. Agendas also will be somewhat more complete so the public understands what will be discussed.

Attempts also are going to be made to provide reports during the public meetings on various aspects of the library, such as children's and computer services and librarian duties, Vagnozzi said.

Trustees also will try to make reports throughout the year in addition to the annual budget report to the Farmington and Farmington Hills city councils. The two cities share financing of

the library system. "This will be a kind of progress report — a mid-year report," Vagnozzi said.

Trustees also agreed to Vagnozzi and Stout-Jeddy's suggestion that the library open on Sundays in the winter. "The board agreed, but it is going to depend on additional funds," Vagnozzi said.

The library is open 10 a.m. to 5 p.m. Saturdays during the summer. The proposal is to open the library from 1-5 p.m. Sundays during the school months, September through May. Mondays through Fridays the library is open 10 a.m. to 9 p.m.

THE MAJORITY of public complaints have to do with the lack of weekend library hours, Papal said. "The public wants it."

When the library opened on Sundays several years ago, it was found that circulation was higher on that day than throughout the week, Papal said. If Farmington or Farmington Hills residents want to use a library on the weekend they have to go elsewhere, she said.

A compilation of data gathered by library officials throughout metropolitan Detroit indicates many libraries of similar size to the Farmington system in communities of similar size are open on the weekends. The communities include Grosse Pointe, Southfield, Rochester Hills, West Bloomfield Township, Milford, Oak Park, Oxford, Redford Township, Taylor and Trenton. Vagnozzi and Stout-Jeddy also suggested more in-depth use of cable access programming to highlight the library and its services.

Headquarters are upgraded

Farmington Hills City Council will spend about \$21,000 to improve the upper level of the fire department's headquarters at 28711 Drake.

The project will include partitioning of the upper level to provide more space for department fire prevention and suppression training and safety education for the public.

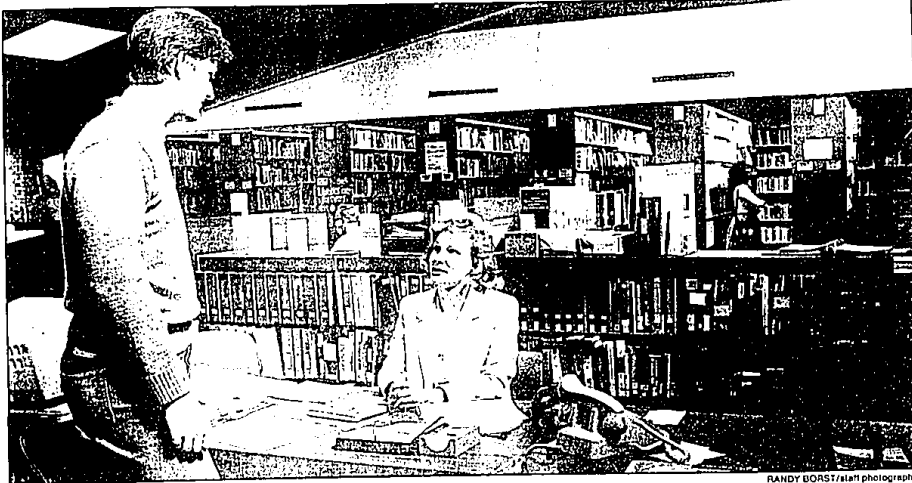
