## Hills rebids lighting project

Farmington Hills officials expect the installation of lights at Harrison High School's baseball fields to be completed before spring, despite a decision to seek a new set of construction bids.

The proposed installation of lights at the Harrison fields is the result of an agreement between the city and the Farmington Public Schools to provide more playing time and space for community teams. Under the agreement, the city will provide and pay for a lighting system for two baseball fields.

Lighting feeleds will enable the city's parks and recreation teams to play on the school district-owned fields after dark. School district teams will continue to use the fields.

Although Councilman Charles Williams supported rebidding the project, he raised concern about the lack of local contractors who offered bids. He suggested efforts be made to contact more contractors in the rebid.

The agreement between the city and school district comes at a time when residents have expressed concern over the Parmigton areas lack of sports facilities.

Cooperation between the city and school district is easier and less costly than the city buying land specifically for the construction of new ball fields, city officials ament also bolds the city responsible for improving the fields when necessary, such as repairing or replacing fencing, improving the composition of infelds and installing permanent restrooms. The city also is responsible for maintenance of the field and parking area.
