

## police/fire calls

Listed below are highlights of Farmington-area police and fire calls received during the past week:

● **ASSAULT ALLEGED**  
A 17-year-old Livonia man is charged in the attempted murder of a 25-year-old security guard at a Farmington Hills miniature golf course.

Farmington Hills Police have petitioned Oakland County Probate Court to waive jurisdiction so that a 16-year-old juvenile can be charged as an adult with the same felony.

The security guard, Terrence E. Metz-

zler of Detroit, is reported recovering from gunshot wounds to both forearms and to the abdomen, Police Chief William Dwyer said.

Arraigned Friday before District Judge Michael Hand of Farmington, Paul A. Dober stood mute to one count of assault with intent to commit murder. An innocent plea was entered on the defendant's behalf.

Hand set cash/surety bond at \$10,000, 10 percent of which had to be posted to gain release pending a preliminary examination in 47th District

Court. Conviction of the felony charge carries a maximum penalty of life in prison.

Dober also is charged with one count of possession of a firearm in the commission of a felony, punishable upon conviction by a mandatory two-year prison term.

Police seized the suspected weapon during a search of the defendant's home, Dwyer said.

"The crime lab matched the rifle with the slug removed from the security guard," he said.

Dwyer credited detectives Craig Summers and Charles Nebus with producing the evidence necessary to secure a warrant from the Oakland County Prosecutor's Office Sept. 18.

The shooting occurred at 9:10 p.m. Sept. 3 at Putt 'n' Games, 30749 Grand River.

According to the police report, Metzler said he was standing near a fence when he heard a shot, then felt his arms tingle. He managed to walk into the building before collapsing near a counter. He said there were a few cars parked in the south lot but he did not notice anyone suspicious.

Dwyer said he would not release further details about what led to Dober's arrest until the preliminary exam.

Officer Gilbert Kohls was taken by ambulance to Providence Hospital, Southfield, Tuesday, where he was treated, Chief William Dwyer said.

Jeffrey L. Blackburn, 26, of Fenton and Thomas J. Lopp, 35, of Holly were arrested in connection with the alleged felony — larceny over \$100, which carries a maximum penalty upon conviction of five years in prison or a \$2,500

● **MATERIALS STOLEN**  
About \$750 worth of wood siding was stolen from a house being built on Lancaster, according to a Farmington Hills Police report. The theft occurred between Sept. 20 and 21.

More than \$800 worth of building materials were stolen from a building under construction on Orchard Lake Road, near 12 Mile, according to another police report. The theft occurred between Sept. 21 and 23.

● **COCAINE SUSPECTED**  
Three men, ticketed for illegal possession of marijuana and narcotics paraphernalia, are suspected of illegally possessing cocaine, according to Farmington Hills Police.

According to the police report, Officer John Markey confiscated the following items from their car about 10 p.m. Sept. 19:

- two plastic bags of suspected cocaine,
- two marijuana pipes,
- two rolling papers.

● **CARS DAMAGED**  
Farmington Hills firefighters doused two suspicious vehicle fires on Colgate about 2:30 a.m. Monday.

A fire in the passenger compartment of a van left about \$2,200 in damage. A front-seat fire in a car caused about \$250 in damage, Fire Lt. Peter Baldwin said.

Baldwin labeled the fires suspicious because, as he put it, "it's hard to believe two vehicles would catch on fire on their own at 2:30 in the morning."

## Broomfield supports simplified tax return

U.S. Congressman William Broomfield, R-Birmingham, has joined as an original co-sponsor of legislation to repeal the new IRS Keogh account reporting rules.

The current law calls for self-employed owners of sole-beneficiary Keogh accounts to file the long and complicated 5500-C form.

Broomfield, a senior Republican on the House Small Business Committee, wants the IRS to promptly prescribe a simplified information return that will be less burdensome and time consuming.

THE NEW RULES were implemented by the IRS after Congress approved the Tax Equity and Fiscal Responsibility Act (TEFRA) of 1982. TEFRA repealed most of the special limitations and restrictions on the design and operation of Keogh plans making them equal to corporate pension plans. Form 5500-C is the same form currently filed by corporate plans.

Broomfield's main concern is that

the self-employed simply do not have the time or resources afforded a large corporation to prepare the long and complex form.

"Requiring the self-employed to file Form 5500-C is simply overburdensome and clearly onerous," said Broomfield, whose district includes the Farmington area.

Broomfield previously supported legislation to repeal the strict IRS compliance record-keeping requirements for the business use of automobiles and was actively involved when Congress approved repeal legislation in May.

Broomfield said he believes small business is often taken for granted by the Federal Government.

"It seems like all too often the small business person is getting stuck by the IRS. Their ability to meet current paperwork requirements is already stretched thin. Small business cannot continue to prosper in this kind of environment," he said.

● **OFFICER INJURED**  
A Farmington Hills police officer injured his back when he fell about 10 feet through an unfinished stairway to a concrete floor below while breaking

Arraigned before District Judge Margaret Schaeffer Sept. 21, the defendants stood mute. An innocent plea was entered in their behalf. Cash/surety bond was set at \$5,000, pending a preliminary examination in 47th District Court.

According to the police report, Kohls arrived at a house being built on Lancaster about 8:30 p.m. Sept. 20 and saw in the driveway. After confronting Blackburn inside, Kohls ordered him to lie on the ground just outside the house's front door.

When Officer William Maffesoli arrived, Kohls re-entered the house, confronting Lopp and ordering him to lie on the floor just inside the front door. As Kohls backed away to keep a safe distance, he stepped into an open hole in the floor and fell into the basement.

Maffesoli kept watch over the two suspects until other officers arrived, according to the police report.
