## GOLF

Farmington retained city bragging rights in boys golf as the Falcons defended their city championship Friday at Farmington Country Club.

Farmington, with a team score of 424, beat runner-up North Farmington's 448 and Farmington Harrison's 497.

The Falcons' John Borbi was the most medalist with a 78.

Other Farmington scorers were Tom Javor, 80; Brian Allen, 83; Bob Curtis, 88; and Eric Mombalanco, 93.

North's Chris Bayer shot an 84 to lead the Raiders. Other North scorers were Jerry Dutton, 86; Doug McIndoe and Eric Weinberger, 92; and Andy Fritz, 95.

Ken Davidson led Harrison with a 91.

Diane Raddatz helped Farmington Harrison win its dual meet record to 2-1 Thursday.

Tucker won the 200-yard individual medley (2:25.7) and the 100 backstroke, while Raddatz took the 50 freestyle (27.2) and the 500 free (5:49.8).

Other firsts were garnered by Kelly Murary in the 200 free (2:26.0), Roxanne Bennett in the 100 butterfly (1:15.7) and Lisa Skibinski in the 100 breaststroke (1:27.4).

Michelle Harrison, Bennett, Tucker and Raddatz teamed to win the 200 medley relay (2:10.8), while Holly Porta, Karen Baers, Almo Katz and Murary won the 400 free relay (3:21.7).

NORTHVILLE 02, FARMINGTON 79: Northville captured all but two events from the Falcons (1-1) on Thursday.

Carolyn Smith won the 50 freestyle (28.0) and anchored the winning Farmington 200 medley relay. She teamed with Betsy Brown, Lori Kiel and Julie Kendall on a 2:09.66.

## Pioneers blank CMU

Before the season started, Oakland University soccer coach Gary Parsons figured his team had two things last year's NCAA-tournament qualifier lacked: experience and a slightly stronger offensive line.

Neither have helped OU thus far. After winning their first game of the season against the University of Windsor, it took the Pioneers five more games to surpass the .500 plateau. They did that with a 4-0 blanking of Central Michigan Wednesday at OU.

And as one-sided as the score may seem, it should have been worse. OU outshot the Chippewas 30-2, forcing former Livonia Stevenson standout goalie Ken McDonald to make 15 saves.

"We scored four goals but we could have had eight or nine," acknowledged

Parsons. "We've been working on our offense every day in practice."

THE PIONEERS may need more work. They've dominated play in all six of their games, outshooting opponents by a wide margin in each. But the goals just have not come.

"The hardest thing in the game is finishing plays," said Parsons. "We spend about 90 percent of our practices working on scoring, concentrating on both the technical and psychological aspects."

"Slump might be a good word for it. We've been getting the chances. I don't know if it's lack of concentration or what, but they're not going on the net." Parsons still believes he has four forwards "that are all starting-caliber" in

Meally Freeman, Marty Hagen, Mark Christian and Brian Fitzgerald. OU's offense allows for only three forwards, so Parsons has been juggling them to try and find the right combination.

AGAINST CMU, the Pioneers forward line did account for all four goals. Freeman scored at the 13:07 mark unassisted, and Christian made it 2-0 less than five minutes later with assists going to Mike Vigh and Gray Haisick. In the early seconds of the second half Christian made it 3-0, with Vigh and Fitzgerald earning assists. Freeman got his second goal of the game at the 64:42 mark, with Haisick getting his second assist.

The poor start could cost OU come tournament time, but that's something Parsons is unconcerned with at present.

"Right now I'm just worried about getting our game together," he said, "so when we get down to the end of the season we'll be peaking."
