● TITAN MARVELS
The University of Detroit has enjoyed success in both golf and cross country, and a large dose of the credit goes to Observer & Excelsior area athletes.

The golf team finished second at both the University of Windsor Invitational and the Aquinas Classic. At Windsor, Junior Dan Janssen from Redford Union fired a 77 to finish one stroke shy of medalist honors. Included in Janssen's round was a double-eagle, scored on the par-five, 479-yard fifth hole. Host team Windsor won the nine-team tournament.

In the Aquinas Classic, only Olivet bested UD in the 15-team field. John Morad, from Birmingham Brother Ridge, tied for team-best honors with 78. Janssen and Chuck Batcheller, from Lathrup Village, each carded 60s.

In cross country, Ken Dubois from Livonia Stevenson continues to excel. A sophomore, Dubois has been UD's leading runner in each of the team's three events this year. Dubois placed ninth overall in the Akron Invitational, was 15th at the Hillsdale Invitational, and took seventh at the Eastern Michigan Open. His best time for five miles is 25:13 against Akron.

Tom Zakrzewski, the Titans' junior captain from Redford Catholic Central, placed 23rd at Akron in 25:35.

● BRUISING BRITON
Ed Ewald has made his presence felt on the football field. A junior linebacker at Albion College, Ewald, from Redford Catholic Central, paces the Britons in tackles with 30, including a team-high 15 solo hits.

Ewald also proved his versatility in contributing a key play in Albion's 26-20 victory over Wabash. The Britons led 21-20 midway through the fourth quarter when Ewald swiped a Wabash pass

and returned it to the Little Giants' 23. Albion scored what proved to be the winning points moments later.

The victory kept Albion undefeated through three games.

● SUPER STANDOUTS
Ken McDonald and Joe Moreau, from Livonia Stevenson, have played major roles in Central Michigan University's soccer fortunes this season. McDonald, a senior goalkeeper, has two shutouts, 69 saves and a 1.09 goals-against average. Moreau, a senior striker, has five goals and three assists.

Archie Panatieri, a senior co-captain on Albion's soccer team, connected for three goals in the Britons' 7-0 blitz of Nazareth. The Rochester graduate has proved instrumental in helping Albion build a 5-2 record.

Jim Ostrowski, a senior at Grand Valley State from Southfield, boomed a 71-yard punt in helping the Lakers win for the first time since 1983. They ended a 14-game losing skid with a 28-14 victory over Evansville.

The Gatt brothers — Mike and Jeff — had strong performances in Hillsdale's 23-7 win over Ashland. Mike, a quarterback, completed 18 of 34 passes for 189 yards and two touchdowns, while Jeff, a running back, gained 60 yards rushing and caught nine passes for 89 yards. The Gatts are from Livonia and are Redford Catholic Central graduates.

Bob Smedley, from Redford Bishop Borgess, is Adrian's leading receiver. The senior tight end has 12 catches for 149 yards and one touchdown.

Steve Tracy, from Livonia Churchill, is plying Michigan Tech receivers. The senior split end has 14 catches for 159 yards.
