Wreathmakers back for more workshops

Ruth McKinnon and Maggi Dull, who offer wreathmaking workshops every fall, have lined up four sessions this season Thursday through Saturday, Oct. 10-12 in First Presbyterian Church of Farmington's barn, adjacent to the church on Farmington Road and 11 Mile.

Herbal wreaths, the same kind that are seen in the preholiday season every year in Greenfield Village, will be created in workshops beginning at 7 p.m. Thursday, at 9 a.m. and noon Friday; and at 9 a.m. Saturday. Registrations are being taken now in the limited size classes by McKinnon at 661-4911, or Dull at 626-7300. Fee of \$15 covers the instruction, the

wreath form, pins and all the herbal materials needed to complete one wreath in the two-hour workshop.

The two instructors, who give all proceeds from this series of workshops to the church, head up sessions in both herbal wreathmaking as well as wreathmaking with fresh greens, for church groups and garden clubs in many surrounding communities. Herb wreaths were a familiar decoration in colonial homes. They were not necessarily constructed for the holiday season, but remained displayed on the wall year after year. The wreath form has always represented eternity. The fragrance and the beauty of the wreaths will last for many years.

Eastern Stars gather

The Grand Chapter Order of the Eastern Star of Michigan will host its annual session Oct. 8-10 in Wing Stadium, Kalamazoo. The event will mark the 119th session of the oldest Grand Chapter in the world.

Farmington Chapter 239 has one member, Jean Miller, who is serving the Grand Chapter now, and another, Linda Koshowsky, will serve on the Grand Matron's special committee in the coming year. Another member, Mary Lockridge, serves as Grand Representative, which is liaison between

the grand and local chapters. The Order of the Eastern Star is the largest fraternal organization in the world and has about 80,000 members in Michigan.

The 119th convention, called "Light-house of Hope," will host about 4,000 members here and in Canada. There are 23 chapters in Oakland County and each will be represented at the convention.

The Grand Chapter disburses in excess of \$145,000 annually to local charities throughout the state.
