A blood donation takes 30-45 minutes, is painless and can save up to four lives. Blood can be donated by anyone in good health who is between the ages of 17 and 65 and weighs at least 110 pounds.  
Only 3 percent of all eligible blood donors in this country donate blood regularly, according to the Red Cross.
