In fact, persons with autism are markedly vulnerable, with disabilities in many areas of life. Parents of autistic individuals have waged a difficult and thankless battle to achieve basic educational and social programs that can meet the needs of their unique children.

To suggest, even metaphorically, that there is a connection between the enormous multiple problems with which autistic persons must deal, and the very real problems of the bondiedla child motester is to provide the public with judicrous reasons for denying services to the autistic by developing the perception that autistic persons are like murdering child molesters, only more so. 


