

National Fire Protection Association records show that residential fires nationally claim 8,000 lives pach year. Last year, 201 people in Michigan lost their lives as a result of fire. Nearly 30 percent were children younger than 12.

"PLANNING IN advance for fire emergencies would save many of the lives lost annually in home fires and also algailicantly reduce fire-related injuries," according to a Michigan State Police press release.

Firefighters urge residents to practice Operation EDITH (EXIL Drills in the Home). The fire department recommends that each family take part in a fire-safety evacuation drill this week by:

Traw up a floor plan of your house and identify two routes of escape from each room, especially the bedrooms.

Prearrange a safe place for your family to meet outside.

Your escape plan should be tested several times during the year.

IF YOU discover or suspect fire in your house, fireflighters urge that you:

Sound an alarm to alert all occupants.

Sound an alarm to alert all occupants for a favorite pet or valuables. Once out, do not re-enter. Never try to hide from smoke. The best air and hale is near the floor.

Stay low if there is smoke. The best air aominable is near the floor.

Feel the door, If it's bot, or if smoke is coming in around the door, do not open it. Immediately use an alternate escape route.

Prearrange a family meeting place outside the house and wait there for other family member.
