

Learn the ABCs of cable TV equipment

Once a resident is certified to use the cable-television production equipment, the fun begins. Let yourself explore and develop ideas enhancing creativity to its fullest potential.

Do not be overwhelmed with concern for equipment limitations as this may usually be overcome by a "home remedy" and alternative methods.

Emphasis should be upon making best use of all your resources, remembering that neighbors, friends and businesses usually will be delighted to add support. (Remember to give them credit.)

The following is an arena of tips:

- The studio is equipped with a Kyron computer serving as a character generator. This serves as an alternative to handwritten lettering for titles and credits. It has four fonts (letter sizes and styles) and a color palette affording a very creative and professional color selection. Staff needs to have your list of credits several days in advance to prepare a video tape and file for your show.

There are several types of microphones. Lavaliere, pin on or tie clip, when the aesthetics are important, is the overall function (sit down talk show, desk or hand held or tall stand, when you need the sound source to be stationary).

Handheld microphone will pickup sound from long distances and it will pinpoint sound best from one user; the cameras also have built-in microphones. Experimentation is important to determine if levels are adequate for your production need. For example, they are perfect for recording an orchestral quartet.

Real screen projector is available for visuals for talk shows such as travelogues.

- Portable switcher looks as if it were a multiple electrical bar. It allows up to six seconds of video.
- Windcreens are available for all microphones to cut down on air-current interference.
- Plastic crates are lightweight and perfect for accessories.
- Keep a supply of duct tape, talent releases, thumb tacks and extension cords.
- Alert — Make sure you have enough video tape and your batteries are charged.

Mayor Dolan opened the regular public hearing of the Farmington Hills City Council on October 21, 1985 at 7:30 p.m. Members present: Alkatesh, Dolan, Dudley, Marks, Sorensen and Wolf. Absent: Williams. Others present: City Manager Costick, City Clerk Reynolds and City Attorney Bilezikian.

Mayor Dolan declared October 24, 1985, as United Nations Day.

Council deferred Determination of Cass Avenue road improvement to a later date.

Council postponed Cost Hearing for sanitary sewer for 10 Mile Road from Bixar Hill to Inland Road, S&D C-184.

Council approved Vacation of alleyway located 100 feet south of Grayfield between Middlebelt and Tulane in Waddell Wilcox Hymal Co's Kemberton Park Sub.

Introduction of Zoning Map Amendment, Zoning Request 24-3-43 to rezone property on east side of Farmington Road, north of 18 Mile, from R-1 to C-1, was withdrawn by the proponent.

Council denied the extension for Open Space plan for Irv Wilcox Estates in Section 21.

State Representative Wilbur V. (Sandy) Brotherton gave a report on state legislation regarding the placement of Group Homes.

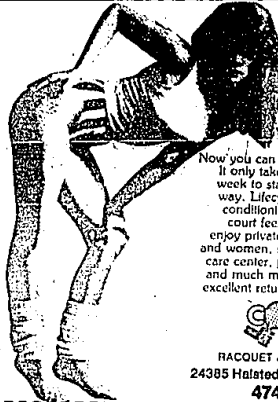
Council approved Preliminary Plat for Hunter's Pointe North Subdivision in Section 5.

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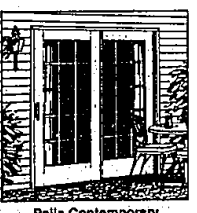
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
