## Child-support bills are hailed

State Sen. Rudy Nichols, R-Waterford, praised the Senate Judiciary Committee for reporting out an 11-bill package to strengthen the enforcement of child-support rulings.

In a bipartisan effort, Nichols sponsored the package in the Senate while state Rep. Debbie Stabenow, D-Lansing, was sponsor in the House.

"We've passed an important first hurdle in setting up stronger, more streamlined, child support enforcement, and in strengthening the visitation rights of non-custodial parents," Nichols said.

The first-term senator, whose district includes the Rochester area, said more than \$500 million in child support arrearages to sweet to Michigan families on public assistance. He said the alarming rate of poverty faced by households headed by women, forcing them to go on welfare, is due in part to these arrearages.

THE STATE legislation was prompted by Con-gress' amendments last summer to the federal child support enforcement program, which man-dates states to improve the collection of child-sup-

dates states to Improve the conection of this observations.

The package is now headed for the Senate floor.

"The bills include sutomatic, mandatory with-holding of income to collect child support whenever an arrearage of four weeks or more occurs," said Nichols. "This withholding can only be appealed on "Indicated fact."

Nichols. "This withholding can only be appealed on a 'mistake of fact."
"Each state is required to enact an 'interstate income withholding act." These acts will better ensure that, regardless of where the payer moves, his income could be withheld if an arrearge occurs."

The statute of limitations in paternity cases has been increased from six years to 18. Paternity actions will be made civil rather than criminal so that the accused father will not have a criminal record. The accused will still be entitled to a trial.

"THE PACKAGE is a balanced approach, which considers the rights of custodial parents, supporting parents and especially minor children," Nichols said.

Among the facts prompting federal-state action,

he said, are:




