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Laciel captured the Glenn award this season. He placed 4th in the state meet. His best race was at the regional where he posted a 16:40 good for seventh place.

Ron Tolson, Wayne Memorial: This senior has been the premier runner at Wayne the past two seasons. He placed seventh at the state meet with a 16:20. He also took an impressive trip at Schoolcraft. He is considering attending Tennessee or Texas.

Bret Thirljung, Wayne Memorial: An all-Wolverine A League runner, the senior posted a 16:26 run at the league meet. He placed eighth at Schoolcraft.

Rob Annett, Livonia Churchill: A senior, Annett took first in seven of eight dual meets this season. His best time was a 16:31 at the regional. He is the reigning Livonia city champ and ran a 47th best 17:01 at the state meet.

ALL-AREA GIRLS FIRST TEAM

Karen Opp, John Glenn: This senior, two-time All-Area standout, saved her best for last. She ran an impressive 19:32 at the state meet which earned her 13th place in the individual race. She was the Western Lakes champion, fourth in the region and runnerup at both Schoolcraft and Wayne.

Leslie Martin, Farmington: A junior, Martin ran cross country for the first time this season. She placed 74th at state with a 20:57. She

took ninth in the Western Lakes and 13th in the regional.

Nicole Jolley, Farmington: The Western Lakes runnerup, the junior placed 26th at the state meet with a 19:55. She was third at RU, fourth at Schoolcraft and fifth at West.

Bonnie Stecker, Farmington: A sophomore, Stecker ran a 34th best 20:03 at the state meet this season. She was fourth in the Western Lakes, sixth at RU and seventh at the regional.
