Man pleads guilty to armed robbery

Two men accused of shooting a Livonia patroliman on the Jeffries Preeway May 6 have pleaded guilty to robbing three people at guapolat in Farmington Hills shortly before the shoot-out.

Appearing before Oakland County Circuit Judge Frederlek Jiem, James Douglas Barton, 23, of Inkster pleaded guilty to three counts of armed robbery, one count of Ieloay Hirarms possession/second offense and one count of habitual offender/third offense.

Casimir Edward Bagadeuins, 20, of Westland pleaded guilty to two counts of armed robbery and one count of telony firearms possession/lirst offense. Sentencing is scheduled for Dec. 17.

Conviction of armed robbery earlies a maximum sentence of Ille in prison. Felony firearms possession/second offense carries a mandatory live-year prison term. Felony firearms possession/first offense carries a mandatory live-year prison term. two-year prison term.

BARTON ALSO faces parole viola-tion hearings. He was on parole from Southern Michigan Prison at Jackson at the time of the robbery and subse-quent shoot-out.

Barton has not yet gone to trial in Wayne County on charges of assault with intent to commit murder and felo-ny firearms possession/second offense in connection with the shooting of Livo-nia Patrolman Gregory Henderson May 6.

A third man who Farmington Hills Police allege was involved in the rob-bery, Arnold E. Sherman, 25, of Garden City, was killed in the shoot-out. Baga-ciunts was wounded and required hospi-

The robbery occurred after 11:15 p.m. May 5 at a house on Nine Mile Road. Police allege that Barton, Bagaciunis and Sherman bound and terror-

ized two men and a woman for 3½ hours during a robbery in which the suspects were looking for drugs.

After brandishing a sawed-off shot-gun, the three men lied up two brothers and assaulted the girlfriend of one of the men. The men demanded drugs, money and other possessions before ransacking the house. They drove away shortly before 5 a.m. One of the broth-ers then drove the woman to Redford Community Hospital and notified Carmington Hills Police, Sgt. Charles Nebus said.

THE WOUNDED officer is a 13-year decorated police veteran. He's still re-

decorated police veteran. He's still re-cuperating.
According to police reports, the shool-out occurred on the Jeffries Freeway near Middlebelt, following a routine traffic stop by Henderson and fellow officer Charles Baron-Klask. The officers were unaware of the Farmington Hills robbery when they stopped the ear for a traffic violation shortly before 3 a.m. The three men in

the front seat of the car were ordered out after the driver, later identified as Barton, could not produce identifica-

BARTON WAS arrested at 6:15 a.m. on Arden Street, about 1½ miles from the shoot-out. A resident called police to report a man with a gun wandering around the neighborhood, police said. Among the property confiscated from Barton's car was suspected marijuana, two abolguns and two handguns. Also selzed were stereo equipment,

amplifiers, a tape deck, a cassette player and a guitar believed stolen in the robbery polico said. Police recovered the handgun be-lieved used in the freeway shooting on Arden Street, where Barlow was arrest-ed. About \$1,000 in cash, believed taken


in the robbery, was found on one of the suspects, police said. Barton was paroled in January from Southern Michigan Prison at Jackson after serving a 26-month sentence on armed robbery and weapons convic-tions in Wayne County Circuit Court.


