All County and School taxes can be paid directly at City Hall, Treasurer's Office, 31555 W. Eleven Mile Road, Farmington Hills, Michigan 48031. The Treasurer's Office will be open for payment of taxes 8:30 a.m. to 4:30 p.m., Monday through Friday, with the following exceptions: Tuesday, December 24, 1985, Wednesday, December 25, 1985, Tuesday, December 31, 1985, Wednesday, January 1, 1986, and February 17, 1986, CLOSED ALL DAY.

For taxpayer's convenience, a night depository, located on the east wall of the front courtyard, is available for after hours tax payments. Also, the tax payments may be made at the following banks, during normal banking hours: National Bank of Detroit (a \$15 fee will be charged by N.B.D. for each tax bill), Michigan National Bank of Detroit (No fee charged), Michigan National Bank of Novi (No fee charged), Michigan National Bank of Farmington (No fee charged), Manufacturers National Bank (No fee charged).

The above banks will accept tax payments until the close of business, February 14, 1986.

Whether you pay your taxes in person, through the mail, or by night depository, be sure to return BOTH COPIES of the tax bill.

By law, PAYMENTS BY MAIL are recorded by the Treasurer on the date actually received. Payments received after February 15, 1986, will be returned with added penalty.

CITY OF FARMINGTON HILLS SUMMARY OF PROCEEDINGS REGULAR PUBLIC HEARING November 18, 1985

Mayor Dolan opened the Public Hearing meeting of the Farmington Hills City Council on November 18, 1985 at 7:30 p.m. Members present: Alarico, Dolan, Bodley, Harris, Sever, Sorocan and Wolf. Others present: City Manager Costick, City Clerk Reynolds, City Attorney Bilbas and Planning Consultant Coates.

Council adopted a Resolution establishing Special Assessment District for a park in Meadowbrook Hills Subdivision and set December 9, 1985 for Cost Hearing.

Council introduced Zoning Map Amendment, Zoning Request 23-4-43 to remove property on south side of Nine Mile Road, east of Power from RA-3 to RC-3, Tax ID. 23-14-301-003 and 002, in Section 24.

Council adopted Zoning Map Amendment, Zoning Request 23-4-45, to remove Lots 24 and 25 of Oakland Hills Orchard Subdivision from RA-3 to OS-2, Tax ID. 23-11-301-004 and 005, in Section 11.

Council introduced Zoning Map Amendment, Zoning Request 23-4-45, to remove approximately 38 acres of land at southwest corner of Twelve Mile and Drake Roads from RA-1 to OS-4, Tax ID. 23-17-201-004, in Section 17.

Revised Open Space plan for Green Hill Commons Park No. 3 and 5 was approved. Council adopted EDC Resolution No. 4 approving Project Plan and Bonds for Orchard Plaza Amenity Project at 25565 and 25580 Orchard Lake Road.

Council enacted Ordinance No. C-60-85, an amendment to Section 11.230 of City Code Subdivision of Land Ordinance to require provision of adequate pump pump discharge into storm sewers and approval of summary for publication.

Council adopted EDC Resolution No. 3 setting hearing date on December 9, 1985 for Modern, Inc. Project at 28700 Grand River Avenue.

Council adopted EDC Resolution No. 1 approving Project Area and Project District Area for Michael and Marion Hitch Project and Resolution No. 1 confirming the appointment of additional EDC Directors.

Council adopted Resolution to revoke license of business selling package liquor to customers for consumption "off premises."

Council established Public Hearing date for Vacation of Colfax and Metroview Roads and also the vacation of an easement in Grand River Crest No. 3 Subdivision on December 16, 1985.

Council agreed to call the City Council meeting of December 21, 1985.

Council awarded contract for 13 Mile Road Storm Sewer Extension, west of Middlebelt to J. C. Harris and Sons in the amount of \$17,724.

Council awarded contract for Detroit Drive Storm Sewer Extension to U. P. Construction, Inc. in the amount of \$28,377.00.

Council extended Open Space completion date for Farmington Green North No. 3 and No. 3 to June 1, 1986 and Letter of Credit to July 1, 1986.
