CITY OF FARMINGTON HILLS
REGULAR CITY COUNCIL MEETING
November 25, 1985

Mayor Dolan opened the regular meeting of the Farmington Hills City Council on November 25, 1985, at 7:30 P.M. Members present: Alkateeb, Dolan, Dudley, Marks, Seaver, Sorenson and Wolf. Others present: City Manager Costick, City Clerk Reynolds and City Attorney Bileau.

Minutes of November 11 and 18, 1985 were approved as presented.

Council enacted Ordinance No. C-41-85, Zoning Request 32-4-85, to rezone land on south side of Nine Mile Road, east of Power Road in Section 34 from RA-3 to MC-3, Tax ID 23-34-201-003 and 002.

Council enacted Ordinance No. C-42-85, Zoning Request 35-8-85, to rezone Lots 24 and 25 of Oakland Hills Subdivision in Section 11 from RA-2 to OS-2, Tax ID 23-11-331-004 and 005.

Council enacted Ordinance No. C-43-85, Zoning Request 37-9-85, to rezone approximately 38 acres of land at southwest corner of Twelve Mile and Drake Roads in Section 17 from RA-1 to OS-4, Tax ID 23-17-201-004.

Council accepted Plante-Moran Audit Report for fiscal year ending June 30, 1985.

Pre-conference approval was granted two members of council to attend Foster Care Facilities Conference on December 17, 1985.

EDC Resolution was adopted setting public hearing date of December 16, 1985 for Michael and Marion Hiltz Project at northwest corner of Drake and I-496.

Council approved contract with Michigan Department of Transportation for crossover improvements on Northwestern Highway from Inlander to Fourteen Mile.

Council adopted Resolution requesting immediate highway improvement to M-102 and Grand River Avenue Interchange by Michigan Department of Transportation.

Council adopted Resolution that the City not participate in the Oakland County Solid Waste Plan.

Council approved cost agreement for traffic signals at Grand River and Halsted/Freedom Roads.

Council adopted Traffic Control Orders for Green Hill and Metroview.

Council introduced an amendment to Snow Removal Ordinance regarding sidewalks adjacent to rear lot lines.

Council approved participation in the 1985 Tri-Party program with the County.

Council adopted a Resolution to explore the creation of a Park Foundation for the Spicer property.

Council adopted resolution authorizing City Manager to contact Michigan Department of Transportation for a noise analysis along I-275 from Eight Mile to one-half mile north of Nine Mile Road for possible construction of sound barriers.

Council approved employment for two employees under Section 10.01A of the City Charter.

Council approved engineering services of Gillette-Webster Engineers, Inc. for survey of cemeteries in the amount of \$4,900.

Council set a study session on December 7, 1985, from 9:00 A.M. to 12:00 noon for discussion of Twelve Mile Road Tax Increment Financing District.

Council approved a purchase order to Wilkie Turf Equipment Company for snow removal equipment in the amount of \$3,053.

Jonathan Grant was reappointed to the Library Board.

Meeting adjourned at 9:55 P.M.

Help feed the hungry

The seventh annual "Operation Can-Do," a month-long drive to collect canned goods to meet the severe needs of the hungry, was launched on Thanksgiving and will continue through New Year's Day.

Founded in 1979 by Elias Brothers Restaurants, "Operation Can-Do" is one of the most efficient food collection programs in the nation. Although the program was originally developed to assist people in Southeastern Michigan, Can-Do has been expanded statewide by Elias Brothers.

Contributions of canned food may be taken to any Elias Big Boy Restaurant, including the one in Farmington and the one in Farmington Hills. Food is then warehoused and distributed to local kitchens and pantries.

While the economic situation has improved for some, the problem of widespread hunger remains critical with no relief in sight. Elias Brothers, with the help of local schools and businesses was able to collect nearly 80 tons of food last year. An important feature of Can-Do is that although the project is conducted throughout the state, food contributions remain in the local areas, assisting hungry neighbors.
