The 6-0 ruling was a deteat for the city of Livonia and a homeowners group in Southful a homeowners group in Southful desired to the city of Livonia and the state Department of Social Services, which licenses group homes for developmentally disabled adults, and Victory Wisdom Nonprofit Housing Inc. The cases were consolidated because of the similarity of issues.

In a 47-page opinion written by Justice Michael F. Cavanagh, the high

court upheld rollings for the defendants by Wayne Circuit Judge Roland L. Ol-zark and Oakland Circuit Judge Robert Webster. Justice Dorothy Comstock Riley didn't take part in the proceed-ings.

AN UNOFFICIAL court summary of the 12-question case made these major points:

Debbig Stahenow, D-Lansing — chairworm of the House Mental Health Committee — said the public should remember that "mental lilness is not the same as dangerous. Legally, if someone is dangerous to themselves or to to others, they cannot be placed in the community."

Patients that would be placed in residential programs are those who have emotional problems, such as depression, or who suffer from a strong lack of self-confidence or who are severely withdrawn, Stabenow said.



"The alternative is not one that is too good," Brotherton said, referring to released patients having no where to go.

THE ISSUES of placing mentally re-tarded persons as opposed to mentally ill persons "are two different situa-tions," Hartsock said.

The placement of mentally iil per-sons "Is what scares people," Hartsock said. "And it concerns me because it is

a different type of problem (than men-tal retardation)."

A balance must be struck between meeting the needs of mentally ill per-sons who are capable of living in group homes and the needs and concerns of the community, Hartsock said. "From our perspective obviously, we have to look at the concerns of our communi-

look at the concerns of our communa-ty."

Both Hartsock and Dolan maintain that more specific information and un-derstanding of the group home issue is needed for both city officials and the public.
