A teenage parenting program that has helped nearly 100 girls in western Wayne County deal with unexpected pregnancy is being phased out. The program, administered by the Northwest Guidance Clinic in Garden City, will likely close when state funding runs out by the end of January, said the project's program director, Tool Charles. Program coordinators as the only hope is to find some other source of money.

some other source of money.

THE STATE Department of Social Services had funded the program as part of a statewide "initiative" last year but discontinued the project here on Sept. 30.

The program has been temporarily continued by special action of the clinic's board of directors, which agreed to fund it through the end of this year. But that money — 18,500 — and some small donations won't see the \$4,000-a-month program cost past January, Charles said.

"We're pursuing the state Department of Mental Health and the local office of the Department of Social Service for some discretionary funds. But it's very unlikely that'll turn over fast enough to stop the discontinuation of the program," Charles said.

SINCE IT was started last year, the counseling/
education program has helped girls from 100 families in northwestern Wayne County, including Westland, Garden City, Wayne, Instater, Pjumouth, Catton, Livonia and Redford Township.

In most cases, the teens who enter the program
want to keep their bables but need to learn bow to
care for them. The girls' average age is 16, and they
range from 18 to 19.

The program offers group counseling sessions at
three area sites — Garden City's Farmington Elementary School, Inskete High School and the Livonia
Bapitist Church. Classes cover such topics as child
development, problem solving, self-management
and budget.

A cadre of volunteers offers help in child-care and
transportation.

According to Charles, a critical time to offer help to a teenager is immediately after she delivers the baby. That is when most drop-outs occur, she said.

gave her what she was looking for when she faced pregnancy as an ummarried recent high school graduate — "n support system with other people in the same situation."

Although the Garden City resident inlinked out her high school courses in time to graduate, the pregnancy interrupted her college plans.

"My friends and parents supported me — my decision to keep the baby — but they didn't know what I was going through. It helped a whole lot to know there were other people around me who did."

Besides support, she said she benefited from weekly lectures that often gave advice cepting and particularly a film on teenage fathers. Said Ostrowski of its impact on her relationship with Andrea's father: "It was a little rocky at first. But

we're beginning to work things out. The program has helped a lot." Now that her daughter is born, she says she still plans to attend the sessions and that teens in ber situation often can help the newer members enter-

FOR THE teens, there has been little other organized help in this field in this area, project director Charles said. "I don't know where we'll refer them," Charles said. "Part of the problem we're having is where do we refer girls to? There are no parenting programs for teenage parents in this area.

"There are public health nurses who will come out for visits, but that's only if there are severe prob-lems — usually you have to have a medical prob-lem."

lem."
Few local high schools offer help for pregnant students, as well. In this area, the only such program is housed at Garden City's Alternative Education Program.
A nearby Oakland County one is located in Parmington. Beyond that, Lincoln Park Schools offer an extensive program which accommodates teens before and after the baby's delivery.

A query to the state DSS's Teenage Parenting Program as to the reason for the funding cut went unanswered this week, but Charles said the decision was part of a \$1.2 million reduction in spending.
