

Falcons capture city mats crown

Farmington won its second consecutive Farmington city wrestling tournament Thursday, coming from behind in all three of its matches.

The Falcons bested Plymouth Canton in a thrilling match 36-27, then trimmed Farmington Harrison 39-30 and North Farmington 39-33.

"It was tough. We give up 12 points right off the bat in every match because of voids in the 96- and 105-pound weight classes," said Farmington coach Barry Walsh. "We really rely on our last three weight classes. They're almost in a situation where they have to win on pins all the time."

John Augustin (185), Dan Parillo (188) and Bill Critcher (heavyweight) came through impressively for the Falcons.

Farmington fell behind to Canton 24-0 before Mike Cody declared Jay Pollard 9-6 at 138 and Darrell Tharnish pinned Lee Moss in 3:37 at 145.

CANTON'S TROY McCall edged Mike Merem 4-3 at 155 and Canton needed just one more victory to clinch the match.

Andy Holliday provided the Falcons with a pleasant surprise at 167, pinning Joe Trame in 3:37.

Then came the big fellas: Augustin, Parillo and Critcher each pinned their opponents to clinch the win.

Tom Breton (112), Dave Dunford (119) and Tim Birely (126) each posted wins for the Chiefs. Canton (1-3) came back to edged North Farmington 39-36 later in the meet.

Against Harrison, Steve Lee (119), Cody and Tharnish posted falls to help Farmington win. Harrison was void in the last two classes.

The Hawks Pat McFadden handed Augustin his first loss of the season with a hard-fought 5-4 decision at 165. Pat Dugas scored a pin at 167. Cliff Alcanara, undefeated on the day, won his match at 112, taking a 10-4 decision against Farmington's T.J. Armstrong.

The Hawks dropped a 46-34 decision to North.

AUGUSTIN SCORED the pivotal win for Farmington in its victory against North. At 185, he pinned tough Brian Haack in 3:40. Parillo, Armstrong, Lee, and Bob Woodbeck (126) also scored pins for Farmington. Tharnish won an 8-5 decision against Pat Gallina.

For North (1-4), Paul Cook (138) and Corey Bartsch (155) posted undefeated days. Mark Seyburn, in his first-ever appearance on the mats, pinned Farmington's Andy Holliday in 3:05. Tom Enright (152) also earned a pin against the Falcons, sticking Gary Blair in 1:25.

"For as young as we are, I thought we had a real nice meet," said North coach Dick Cook.

Rocks bring home Glenn title

When it's all said and done, Plymouth Salem will have wrestled in eight major tournaments including the Western Lakes conference meet. Consequently, the Rocks emphasize certain tournaments more than others.

One of the more highly coveted prizes is the prestigious Westland John Glenn Invitational title, and the Rocks went after that Saturday with all guns drawn.

The Rocks succeeded, besting a star-studded 16-team field in the 20th annual mat gathering at Glenn.

The Rocks amassed 154 points in the evenly balanced meet. Warren Woods Tower was second (120%), defending champion Romulus and John Glenn tied for third with 116%. (See statistical summary for complete results.)

OTHER AREA teams involved were Birmingham Brother Rice (fifth with 91% points), Farmington (seventh with 77), Livonia Churchill (ninth with 69), Wayne Memorial and Garden City (tied for 10th with 58), Southfield-Lathrup (12th with 53), Birmingham St. Ignace (14th with 37), Plymouth Canton (15th with 28) and Livonia Stevenson (16th with nine).

Salem's Dave Dameron stole the show. Wrestling

In the 132-pound weight class, Dameron pinned all four of his opponents in a cumulative time of 4:20. He stuck Garden City's Bill Pajot in 12 seconds of the championship match.

For efforts, Dameron was named the meet's most outstanding wrestler — his second such honor in two consecutive weeks.

Ironically, Dameron was Salem's lone champion. Kirk Rentz (138) and Dennis Dameron (112) both lost in the finals. Dennis Dameron, Dave's younger brother, lost a gritty 4-1 decision to Churchill's Salem Yaffai.

"WE PLACED 10 wrestlers in the final six and that's exactly what we wanted," Krueger said. "The right team. Nine different schools had champions for our kids to get to the championship match."

Said Glenn coach Tom Buckalew: "Somebody told me that Salem beat us 20-6 in the wrestle-backs (consolation matches). That gave them the title right there. Nine different schools had champions and there were 12 schools that had kids reach the finals. It was a very balanced tournament."

Glenn was one of three schools posting double clutch (two) wins. Hooley took honors at 105 beating Southfield-Lathrup's Dave LaGrow 12-3.

Also for the Rocks, Dan Schimanski took a 10-2 decision against Tower's Phil Cusumano at 145.
