

police/fire calls

Listed below are some of the Farmington-area, police and fire calls received during the past week:

- HOLIDAY TRAFFIC LOG**  
Farmington Hills Police ticketed four drivers for allegedly operating a motor vehicle under the influence of liquor (OUIL) Dec. 31 and Jan. 1.  
During a typical weekend, police issue four OUIL tickets, Lt. Norman Kilmer said.  
He reported no serious alcohol-related accidents in Farmington Hills on New Year's Eve or New Year's Day. There were two additional sworn officers and three auxiliary officers on patrol during the holiday, he said.  
Farmington Department of Public Safety officers issued three OUIL tickets New Year's Eve and New Year's Day, Director Frank Lauhoff said. Officers responded to several party complaints and a serious-injury accident during the holiday, making it "unusually busy," he added.  
On an average weekend, three drivers are issued OUIL tickets in Farmington, Lauhoff said.
- ASSAULT ALLEGED**  
An 11-year-old boy has been charged with assaulting a female worker on Dec. 30 at the Sarah Fisher Home in

Farmington Hills.  
Farmington Hills Police charged the boy with criminal sexual conduct-second degree in a petition filed with the Oakland County Probate Court Juvenile Division, Sgt. Charles Nease said.  
The boy, a ward of the state, has been lodged in Children's Village, Pontiac.  
According to the police report, the female worker had broken up a fight between the boy and another boy. When her attention momentarily turned elsewhere while trying to calm and counsel the 11-year-old, he reportedly grabbed her from behind, threw her to the floor and punched, choked and sexually assaulted her.  
After freeing herself, the worker ran into an office and called for help while other workers restrained the boy. The worker sustained bruises and scratches to her neck and face, according to the police report.

- FLEEING ALLEGED**  
A 37-year-old Farmington man was arrested about 3 a.m. Jan. 1 for fleeing and eluding officers and operating under the influence of alcohol, according to a Farmington Department of Public Safety report.  
With lights and sirens activated, officers followed the suspect from Grand

River north on Orchard Lake Road into neighborhoods along Shilawasee, Glenmoor and Astor, until he slid through a stop sign at Middlebelt. The driver then eluded a Farmington Hills police car, almost striking it, according to the police report.  
Officers followed the vehicle to a house on Shilawasee, where the driver pulled into a driveway, and arrested him. The man has two prior convictions for driving while intoxicated and one for operating a motor vehicle while under the influence of liquor, according to the police report.

- ALLEGED CAR THIEVES**  
Three Detroit men allegedly tried to steal a car from a carport at a Farmington Hills apartment complex Jan. 2.  
Arraigned Thursday before Judge Margaret Schaeffer of Farmington, Dan Peoples, 18, stood mute to single counts of unlawfully driving away an automobile (UDAA) and fleeing and eluding. Robert Lee Norton, 31, and John Hall, 25, stood mute to UDAA.  
Schaeffer set bond for each at \$10,000 pending a preliminary examination in 47th District Court.  
A Farmington Hills surveillance officer watched as the three parked their car near a 1984 Cadillac Eldorado on Glen Cove in Kendallwood Apartments about 2 a.m. Jan. 2. Surveillance and uniformed officers arrested Norton and Hall in their car at 12 Mile and Orchard Lake. Officers arrested Peoples in the Cadillac on eastbound I-696. The steering column was damaged and pry marks were found on a window, according to the police report.  
Before the men entered Kendallwood, officers said they saw them

cruise the parking lots at Echo Valley and Williamsburg Townhouse.  
Conviction of UDAA, a felony, carries a maximum penalty of five years in prison. Conviction of fleeing and eluding, a misdemeanor, carries a maximum one-year jail term.

- RESIDENT ROBBED**  
A Farmington man was robbed of \$42 as he returned to his home on Valley View Circle early Dec. 31, according to a Farmington Department of Public Safety report.  
As the resident parked in front of his house, he was approached by two men. One allegedly grabbed him around the neck and reached into his pocket, taking money. The robbers left the scene in a late-model sedan, according to the police report.
- VEHICLE FIRE**  
A vehicle left for repair by a Farmington Hills resident at March Tire Co., 33014 Grand River, caught fire just after 6 p.m. Jan. 2, according to a Farmington Department of Public Safety report.  
Officers arrived to find fire coming from the engine of the four-door Mercury. No damage estimate was available, according to the public safety report.
- SCHOOL VANDALIZED**  
Gunshot holes were found in the front-door glass and in an office window at Lutheran High School Northwest, 20175 Highmeadow, Dec. 29-31, according to a Farmington Hills police report.
