

## police/fire calls

Listed below are some of the Farmington-area police and fire calls received during the past week.

### ● ALLEGED ASSAULT

A 35-year-old man sexually assaulted his possibly pregnant live-in companion Monday night, investigators allege.

The 33-year-old Farmington woman was treated at Botsford General Hospital, Farmington Hills, for bruises and scrapes to the back, chest, neck and leg.

Arraigned Tuesday before District Judge Michael Hand of Farmington, Ronald Steven Disner, pleaded innocent to one felony count of criminal sexual conduct in the first degree. Conviction could bring a maximum penalty of life in prison.

Hand set bond at \$50,000 pending a preliminary examination in 47th District Court on Jan. 17.

A Farmington Department of Public Safety report said Disner reported a medical emergency — a "possible miscarriage." The call followed a two-hour attack on the woman, who was beaten, choked and sexually assaulted until she bled and lost consciousness, officers allege.

Disner had fresh scratch marks on his face, possibly made by the woman in self-defense, according to the police report.

The suspect also allegedly choked the woman with an appliance cord and burned her with a lit cigarette, the police report said.

The victim told officers she was four months pregnant and that Disner was the father. Disner said she was pregnant, but possibly not at the time of Monday night's alleged incident, according to Commander Thomas Cox of the Farmington Department of Public Safety. Pregnancy results have not been verified.

The couple had been living together for four months, Cox said. Disner and the victim were evicted from their Seven Mile/Telegraph apartment one week ago and were living in Farmington with a male acquaintance, according to the police report.

### ● ASSAULT ALLEGED

A Detroit man tried to drive his car into a Farmington Hills officer, then led the officer on a high-speed chase that ended when the man drove into a second officer's patrol car, police allege.

Arraigned Saturday before District Judge Margaret Schaeffer of Farmington, Walter Wayne Plachetzki, 25, stood mute to two counts of felonious assault, punishable upon conviction by a penalty of up to four years in prison and a \$2,000 fine.

Schaeffer set bond at \$2,000 pending a preliminary examination in 47th District Court.

Plachetzki also was charged with three misdemeanor counts: failure to obey a police officer's signal, possession of marijuana, and driving on a suspended or revoked license.

According to the police report, officer John Markey responded to a call of a car in a ditch on Silawasssee, east of Middlebelt, about midnight Saturday. The driver was outside his car.

As Markey got out of his patrol car, the motorist got into his car and tried to drive out of the ditch. When Markey ordered him to shut the engine and get out of the car, the motorist again tried to drive out of the ditch in the officer's direction, allegedly forcing the officer to jump out of the way, police said.

After backing out of the ditch, the motorist again accelerated quickly in Markey's direction, again allegedly forcing the officer to retreat. The motorist then took off westbound on Nine Mile. With lights and siren activated, Markey pursued the motorist to Middlebelt, Silawasssee, Grand River and Eight Mile at speeds up to 70 mph, police said.

At Woodworth in Redford Township, the motorist stopped quickly, turned around and headed west in the eastbound lanes of Eight Mile directly at Markey's patrol car, allegedly forcing the officer to take evasive action.

At that point, the motorist drove south on Woodworth onto a sidewalk, almost hitting a building. After Markey and Farmington Hills Officer Wayne Beerbower boxed in the car, the motorist drove into Beerbower's car, police said. The motorist, identified as Plachetzki, then was arrested.

### ● INN VANDALIZED

Renters left about \$300 in room damage in their wake at the Red Roof Inn, 24300 Sinacola Court, Jan. 1-2.

The vandalized room was the scene of damaged mattresses, strewn-about food and liquids, and empty beer containers. A telephone jack was cracked and a nightstand was missing, according to a Farmington Hills police report.

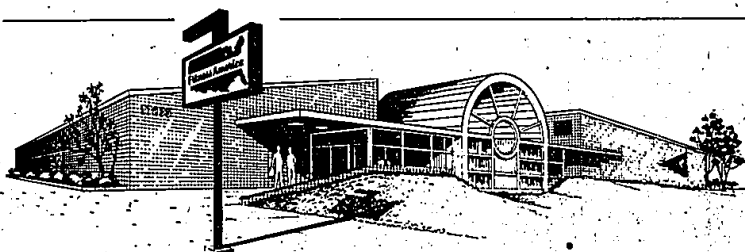
