Country Day slates scholarship exams

Detroit Country Day School is inviting students from throughout the Detroit area to compete in its annual scholarship examinations Saturday, Jan. 18.
The testing will be held from 8:30 a.m. to 12:45 p.m. on the main campus at 13 Mile and Lahser roads in Beverly Hills.
Students entering grades seven through 11 beginning in September are eligible to participate.
Grants will be awarded to finalists in the competition on the basis of academic achievement and potential, co-

curricular talent and accomplishments, and financial need.
Financial need is required for all scholarship grants and is determined by the School Scholarship Service of Princeton, N.J. No full scholarship grants are awarded.
To register for the scholarship examinations, students should call the admissions office at 646-7177, Ext. 43. The fee for testing is \$15, payable on the day of the examination. Each participant will be asked to submit a copy of his or her most recent report card.

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REASONS FOR NOT TAKING MEDICINE
There are a number of reasons why you may not take a medicine as directed.
You may find that you are experiencing an unwanted side effect. For example, hearing loss can accompany the use of high-dose aspirin. If you note this problem while on aspirin, you may stop the drug to see if your hearing improves. You will have decided to do so without first calling the doctor to obtain his advice.
Another reason for not taking medicine as directed is that the instructions for its use aren't clear. One set of directions may be on the bottle, but you recall the doctor discussing another set during the appointment.
In some instances, you are the victim of information overload. Exactly what the doctor said about taking medication got lost in a long exchange of questions, answers, and decisions. Or, there wasn't enough time to explain why the drug was appropriate, and thereby overcome your doubts about its use.
The point is that in most cases of not taking prescription as directed, you have a reason that the physician should respect.
