City backs E-9-1-1 bill

A bill to fund an emergency tele-phone system by charging local tele-phone users statewide received a unan-imous endorscment Jan. 6 from the Farmington City Council. This came after Farmington received a letter from Oak Park re-vention uncert for the mature.

received a letter from Oak Park re-questing support for the measure. The bill "provides for the establish-ment and implementation of emergen-ety telephone districts for E-9-1-1 (Emergency 9-1-1)," according to a re-port from City Manager Robert Dead-man of Farmington. Districts would be established by the county board of commissioners "subject to public hear-lays and bacard action."

Program financing would occur through an "cmergency telephone charge," not to exceed 2 percent of the highest-approved single phone line tar-tif, to be paid by each service user. Deadman stid. The bill is expected to help local gov-sorbed by the county. Oakland County has agreed to pay the cost of rewiring Michigan Bell wire centers to accom-modate the emergency phone system.
