
MOST HOUSE plants can be propagated by breaking a branch at the joint, placing the cutting in vectoricallic or damp sand as a rooting medium. Later, when roots have formed it can be placed in rich, well-drained soil. It is against the rule 'to peck' at the cutting for at least three weeks to see if the process is successful. This is an ideal time to seek a plant of opiphylum. Recalling many years of watching the large plant belonging to Aluce Close, I telephoned her for her sage advice in developing a huge plant with so many flowers. "Touch of Closs" is a hybrid tea with a unique coral and cream color with blooms 4 by to 5 to inches. It is iteal for a winner, is another hybrid tea with a blend of yellow, peach and orange busing to scarlet. It is sweetly scented with the blooms averaging 5-6 inches.
