- HOUSE FIRE**
 No one was home when a fire gutted a rear room in a one-story house on Hemlock Feb. 3.
 Farmington Hills Police Officer C.J. VanMeter discovered the late-morning fire. When firefighters arrived, heavy smoke was evident. Flames were confined to the gutted room. There was heavy smoke damage throughout the house, said Lt. Peter Baldwin of the Farmington Hills Fire Department.
 Baldwin estimated damage and loss at \$15,000.
- BREAK-INS REPORTED**
 Three break-ins to Farmington businesses were reported last weekend, according to the Farmington Department of Public Safety.
