School chief search gains steam

Local residents and school staff members want a "humanistic" person with "a wholistic approach" running Farmington Public Schools, according to a consultant involved with selection

to a consultant involved with selection of a new superintendent.

Consultants from the Michigan Association of School Boards (MASB) visited 25 locations districtwide, Monday and Tuesday, at the school board's re-

and Tuesday, at the senson poarra a crquest.
Meetings were scheduled to involve the community and school staff in selecting a new school chief. Staff and parents attended the 45-minute sessions. One consultant estimated he spoke with 40-50 people during six sessions Monday.

The information will be compiled and a written report given to the school board within two weeks, according to Michael Bugenski, director of community.

nications and publication of the MASB.
The report will be used by the board to
help set guidelines for screening appli-cations.

The Lansing-based MASB was retained by the board to aid in the superintendent search.

"If everything goes well, the board will make an announcement (of the new superintendent) in May or June,"

he added.

BROCHURES ADVERTISING the
superintendent's opening were malled
Monday to a national MASD list of prospective candidates. Bugenski said.
They have until mid-March to apply for
the superintendent's post.

School board members will screen
each application, "whitting the list
down to 7-12 applicants, then to three
finalists," he added. "They (the boar
list) respectively lib ave to spend 15-20
hours in the screening process. The
board has full control to fulfill the vision you have for your district."

SIX DISTRICT collective bargaining unit leaders met with Bugenski in a special session Monday afternoon, giving their collective, written suggestions for superintendent selection guidelines. An initial concern involved searching on a national basis. One member felt "Michigan is a forerunner in collective bargaining" and that applicants from outside the state "might not bave a

The MASB expects to attract 70-100
applicants for the position, including
"several" from the current Farmingtion administration, he said.
"Farmington has the ability to attract a lot of candidates." Bugenski
said. "We'll have no shortage of upplications."
The district seeks an individual with
teaching and administrative experience, he added.
Although teachers, parents and staff
at each school level had individual concerurs, most wanted a "clone of Lew
Schulman," the ex-superintendent who
retiried Dee. 21, according to Bugenski.
"We want the person who will best fit
the community."

SIN DISTRICT collective barealains

was approved in January by a 8. leader commented.
As more positions become available in the Farmington district, union representatives requested "a sensitivity" to hiring women and minorities by the new superintendent. They also want equal treatment of employees at all levels, in all departments, to be continued.

Appointment of the MASB consulting group was approved in January by a 5-1 voice of the school board. The group offers admisstrative and celerical services — including the printing and mailing of brochures and network contacts — for a set fee of \$2,500. The board approved a \$10,000 budget, which is expected to cover the MASB fee plus other expenses related to the search.
