## Added muscle

On Aug. 2, 1785, the 36-gun Frigate Alliance, the last of a makeshift Revolutionary War Navy, was sold by a penniless, powerless Continental Congress.

The Continental Navy's squadron and cruisers took nearly 200 British vessels as prizes during the war. After almost nine long years of humiliation, the high seas, a new Congress, empowered by a new Constitution, took the vital step of funding six new frigates — one appropriately named USS Constitution — and added muscle to the American image.
