Entrees were a real let-down. The prime rib (a specialty, according to our watter, at \$13.95) was thinly cut and almost without taste at all. The broited Norwegian salmon (a recommended daily special at \$15.95) was also extremely bland and forgettable. A note on the menu indicated we could order fish "Cajun-style" – the latest rage – so we tried swordfish that way. While it was spicy, the dish was not truly Cajun, just blackened/almost burned. It was

the best of the three but not at all in the the best of the three but not at all in the same league with, for example, Louisiana Purchase's food in Windsor. Vegetable garnishes served with the entrees were cooked nicely. ENTREE, VEGETABLES AND GARNISHES — 30 points maximum. Points awarded — 21.

The selection of desserts was better. The Chambord hummer, \$4.25, had a rich rasphery laste and a creamy consistency. The chocolate mint flan, \$3.25, was light and minty. The Bananas Foster were not flambeed at the table and lacked cinamon, but we enjoyed them. DESSERT AND COFFEE—10 points maximum. Points awarded—8.

Although the setting is attractive, the food was expensive at \$70 per couple. The disties are bland and unimaginative. Perhaps that will appeal to some patrons who are more interested in the atmosphere than in exciting food, but you can expect to pay for it. PRICE/VALUE — 15 points maximum. Points awarded — 10.

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
