Listed below are some of the Farmington-area police and fire calls received during the past week:

TEENS ARRESTED
Two Farmington Hills teen-agers and a 20-year-old Redford Township man were charged with larceny from a building, following the alleged theft Feb. 10 of two cases of beer from a 7-11 store at 29375 10 Mile, according to Sgt. Dennis Rochford of the Farmington Hills police.

The three were arrested after officers in an unmarked car saw two of the youths enter the 7-11 store and, moments later, run to a car in which the third was waiting. The two were allegedly each carrying a case of beer.

MAN CHARGED
A 24-year-old Detroit man was charged with one count of receiving and concealing stolen property in excess of \$100, following the alleged theft of two video recorders, according to Sgt. Dennis Rochford of the Farmington Hills police.

Arraigned Feb. 17 before District Judge Michael Hand of Farmington was Cedric W. Porter, who pleaded not guilty. He was released on \$2,500 bond pending preliminary examination. Porter was arrested Feb. 16 after allegedly taking two video recorders, valued at \$748, out of a trash bin behind ABC Appliance, 29325 Orchard Lake, according to a Farmington Hills police report.

An officer in an unmarked car reportedly saw the man back his car into an alley and up to the trash bin. The man then allegedly removed the recorders from the bin and placed them in the back seat of his car, the report said.

SUSPECT FLEES
A man attempting to return an allegedly stolen brass crane to a Farm-

ington store Feb. 18 for a refund, left before officers could detain him, according to a Farmington Department of Public Safety report.

The suspect entered Pier One Imports, 33029 Grand River, and tried to obtain a refund for the brass bird, which was reportedly stolen from a Pier One store in Lansing, the report said.

He attempted to return the stolen item at a Livonia Pier One store before coming to Farmington. Farmington officers confiscated the bird for evidence.

UNARMED ROBBERY
An Oak Park resident was reportedly robbed of \$215 by three men in the parking lot of Hunters Square, 91005 Orchard Lake, at about 4:25 p.m., Feb. 19, according to a Farmington Hills police report.

The money was taken after the victim agreed to purchase a ring for \$40 from one of the three men. After paying for the ring, and as the man walked away, one of the three reportedly grabbed him from behind and struck him in the face. The cash was taken out of the man's pocket, according to police.

GUN-TOTING TEEN SPOTTED
A man reported seeing a teen waving a 45-caliber BB-gun from a car window just after 7 p.m. Feb. 19, according to a Farmington Department of Public Safety report.

While traveling northbound on Farmington, just south of Nine Mile, the man heard "something hit his vehicle," then noticed the passenger in a vehicle next to him brandishing the gun, the report said. Officials are investigating the incident.

BREAK-IN ATTEMPT

reported an attempted break-in occurred in late January, while they were home, according to a Feb. 19 Farmington Department of Public Safety report. The suspect attempted to enter the house, but was scared away upon discovering someone home. There were no injuries or items stolen, the report said.
