

Lawmaker backs essential insurance bill

An area lawmaker praised the state House for approving an essential insurance reform bill, which contains several important anti-auto theft provisions and will give the free enterprise sys-

tem a chance to keep rates reasonable in Michigan. State Rep. Wilbur V. "Sandy" Brotherton, R-Farmington, said the legislation (SB 647) is good news for consumers continually subsidizing the high auto insurance rates in Detroit, where more than 42,000 vehicles were stolen in 1984.

One of the key provisions of this bill is the initiative against auto theft. That is the heart of the problem. Until we address this issue, rates will always be too high," Brotherton said.
