

Miss Teen America entry forms available

Contenders for the 1987 Miss Teenage America title may obtain entry forms at any U.S. K mart discount department store, the retailer announced today.

K mart Apparel Corp., a subsidiary of K mart Corp., is one of the sponsors for the program. Other sponsors include Foster Grant Sunglasses and America's Dairy Farmer-National Dairy Board.

Miss Teenage America is an achievement program to recognize outstanding young women between the ages of 13 and 18, according to Teen Magazine, which operates the program.

The Miss Teenage America program selects contestants on the basis of scholastic achievement, general awareness, individual accomplishment, community service, poise, personality and appearance.

THE YOUNG woman who is named Miss Teenage America 1987, will be awarded a \$15,000 college scholarship, an entire wardrobe from K mart Apparel and her own monthly column in Teen Magazine. Girl Scout cookie sales underway

Girl Scouts begin the delivery of their cookie orders this week, then will set up booths in area supermarkets to continue their sale through the month.

Cooperating supermarkets in Farmington and Farmington Hills are Farmer Jack, Kroger, A & P and Great Scott.

Scouts from Troops 2027, 3270, 3108, 3504, 1272, 1276 and 1426 will man the booths after school, some evenings and all weekends for the sale that generates more than half of their annual operating income.

"Our girls are using their cookie money to go to camp in May," said Kathy Bricker, who spoke of the neighbor-

hood cluster of troops she heads that includes 380 girls. "That was voted on a long time ago."

Money from the sale is used Council-wide to support a wide variety of programs designed to help girls develop skills necessary for living in today's world.

Cookie money defrays the costs of sending girls to the U.S. Space Camp and other travel opportunities, supports camp maintenance and programs, leadership training, Arab and Latino Girl Scout programs. It also provides funding for local troop projects.

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
