Council is expected to consider a lease for a major park property dwelling, the hiring of a fulltime video specialist for the Department of Special Services, and an agreement with Consumers Power Co. for the relocation of a natural gas line on 13 Mile, between Haggerty and Halsted roads. Council is expected to accept a E-911 public service answering point (PSAP) designation for the Village of Franklin, Village of Bingham Farms and Southfield Township for the emergency dispatch agreement with Franklin, The Farmington Hills Fire Department will present the 1985 annual report. Council will also consider appointments to boards and commissions.

Public hearings are also scheduled for the following:

- The establishment of a special assessment district for dust control on improved streets and the award of the 1986 dust control contract.
- Cost hearing for road improvements on Sunnydale Street.
- Cost hearing for road improvements for Geraldine Road.
- Cost hearing for road improvements for Bridgeman Ave.
- Consideration of vacating sanitary sewer easements in Section 35, south of Grand River, east of Albion.
- Introduction of zoning map amendment for a rezoning request from RA-3 to RCE on parts of lots 43, 44, 45 and 46 on Osmus Street, between 8 Mile and Junction.
- Introduction of zoning map amendment for a rezoning request from RA-2 to B-3 on the east side of Orchard Lake, south of Rockshire.

Council will review and consider recommended bylaws for the city's Downtown Development Authority and discuss the 1986 Commercial Assistance Program through Oakland County. Also discussed will be a report on pending litigation with Pal Jooyis, Inc., also known as Bootleggers. A meeting will be scheduled with the Planning Commission to discuss Planned Unit Development. Two sign variance requests — from Ray Lucas and Mike Mikolowski — will be heard by the council.
