ROBBERY REPORTED

Two men, one armed with a handgun, robbed a resident of her necklaces Thursday afternoon, according to a Farmington Hills police report.

The woman was in her kitchen in the 10 Mile-Orchard Lake area when she heard a knock on the door. When she opened the door, she was confronted by two men, believed to be between 18 and 25. One of the men was holding a handgun pointed at the ground. When he demanded the woman's two necklaces, she handed them over. The men then left in an older, rusty, small car. The necklaces were valued at \$2,800, according to the police report.

TEEN DETAINED

A Farmington High School student was detained March 10 after suspected use of marijuana was found on him, according to a Farmington Department of Public Safety report.

A petition will be filed in Oakland County Probate Court Juvenile Division, charging the youth with violating the controlled substances act, officials said.

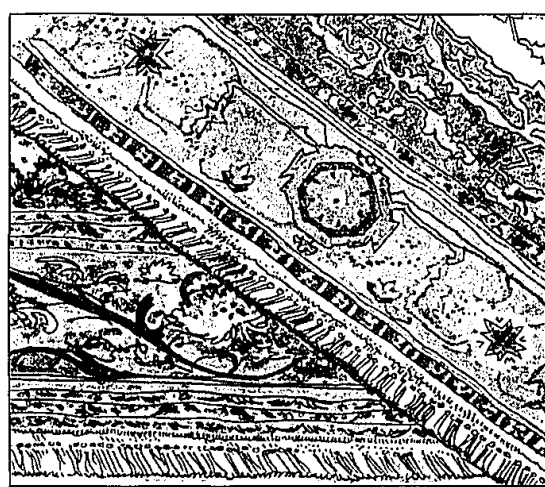
