**'Dance Fever' sets Detroit audition dates**

"Dance Fever" returns to Detroit to hold auditions for local contestants.

Preliminaries begin at 8 p.m. Wednesdays, April 23 and 30, in J.L. Scagulls, 24239 McNichols, Detroit and Tuesdays, May 13 and 20, in Club Tubbey 1940 Woodbridge, Detroit.

Of the four couples from the Detroit area chosen at last year's auditions, one duo went on to win the \$56,000 "Dance Fever" grand prize.

The events are coordinated by "Dance Fever" winners Cindy Conn and Mike Leach. Dancers have two minutes to audition before a panel of judges. Costumes are recommended and contestants must bring their own music on cassette or record.

The participants cannot be associated or connected with the producers of "Dance Fever," their staff, employees or any person participating in the show upon which the participant appears, Merv Griffin Productions or 20th Century Fox or the judges of the auditions; or CBS or NBC Television Networks or WDIV-TV.

There will be prizes of cash or merchandise awarded during the search for dancers since this is an audition only, not a contest.

**Don't park in their place**

A handicapped parking place is not a special privilege for a disabled person, says the national commander of Disabled American Veterans. "It is not even a convenience," he adds. "It is a necessity."

He explains that spots close to stores are what handicapped people need. "It may be a pain in the neck for an able-bodied person to walk a much longer distance with a loaded shopping bag in each hand," he notes.

Edward Gallan points out that DAV is not asking for sympathy. It is asking for understanding about things like handicapped parking zones marked with the international handicapped access symbol. Others should not park there.

"But think of someone carrying a heavy load over that same distance on artificial legs. It can cause serious pain, perhaps even bleeding. And the person wearing prosthetic legs is more susceptible to falling than an able-bodied person."
