CITY OF FARMINGTON HILLS SUMMARY OF PROCEEDINGS REGULAR CITY COUNCIL MEETING APRIL 14, 1988

Mayor Alkateeb opened the regular meeting of the Farmington Hills City Council on April 14, 1988 at 7:30 p.m. Members present: Alkateeb, Butler, Marks, Sever, Sorenson and Wolf. Members absent: Dolan. Others present: City Manager Costick, City Clerk Reynolds, and City Attorney Bibeau.

Mayor Alkateeb presented awards to winners of Energy Poster Contest. The minutes of March 24, 1988 were approved as amended and the minutes of March 31, 1988 were approved as published.

Mayor Alkateeb proclaimed the month of May, 1988 as "Poppy Month" and May 15-17 as "Poppy Days" and the week of April 30 as the "National Consumers Week."

Council confirmed final plat approval for Rolling Oaks West in Section 5. Council accepted the proposed plan of the Oakland County Road Commission for the widening of Twelve Mile Road Bridge at Pebble Creek between Inkster and Middlebelt with contingencies.

Council directed administration to complete and return to Department of Social Services before April 17, 1988, the license application for an Adult Foster Care Facility at 21521 Waldron.

Approval was granted to Finnish Center, 35209 Eight Mile Road, for annual Ethnic Festival on May 30-June 1, 1988.

Date of May 19, 1988 was established for public hearing for street name change of Eleven Mile Road to Pleasant Valley at Drake Road.

Community Development Block Grant Program review was postponed from meeting of April 21 to April 28.

Amendment to Section 80.455 (1) (f) of the Penal Code (Open House Parties) was introduced.

Charlotte Olson was appointed to Historical Commission (5 year term to expire 2/1/89). Beatrice Smith was appointed to Beautification Commission (term to expire 2/1/87). and Elaine Siewruk was appointed to Housing Rehabilitation Loan Board (term to expire 2/1/88).

Council accepted 1985 Annual Report from the Police Department.

Council approved concept for Jona Construction to install sanitary sewer at Inkster Road and I-96.

Council awarded bid for 1985/86 pavement joint and crack sealing program to Michigan Joint Sealing, Inc. in amount of \$52,200.

Council awarded bid for 1985/86 concrete pavement replacement program to G. V. Cement Contracting Company in amount of \$83,772.

Resolution was adopted approving waiver from existing requirement to pave a road extension for Holly Hill Drive in Pasadena Park Subdivision.

Resolution was adopted authorizing State Wide Aluminum Products, Inc. to supply and install energy efficient storm windows for City Hall at cost not to exceed \$4,458.41.

Resolution was adopted supporting "Rouge Rescue '88" Day as June 7, 1988.

Resolution was adopted for modification of sewer district for Evergreen/Farmington sewer system for Peperwood Apartments - 1 City of Auburn Hills for approval of amendment to Evergreen/Farmington Sewer Disposal District.

Council approved Final Preliminary Plat for Farmington Glens Subdivision in Section 6.

Council adopted Resolution No. 1, setting the proposed paving and storm sewer district for Farmington Acres Subdivision and Resolution No. 2, setting April 23, 1988 for public hearing to proceed.

Approval process was adopted for Master Storm Drainage Plan.

Barbara Aldrich was appointed Zoning Inspector in accordance with Section 80.2600 Para. A of the Zoning Ordinance.

Date of May 1, 1988 at 7:00 p.m. was established for joint budget meeting with City of Farmington.

Council approved tentative activities schedule for 1988 Mayor's Exchange Day with Rochester Hills.

Meeting adjourned at 10:30 p.m.
