Farmington will save an estimated \$500 purchasing road salt through a blanket state contract, according to information presented to the city council Monday.

Council approved use of the purchase program, which was recently modified to charge municipalities a set annual fee.

Cities with less than 50,000 population, including Farmington, will pay a fee of \$150 per year. Previously, the state charged a two-percent fee on each purchase.
