In their haste to leave Egypt, the Israelites didn't have time to let their dough for bread-baking rise. To this day, unleavened bread (matzah) is eaten during the eightday holiday.

The first two nights of Passover are celebrated in Conservative and Orthodox Jewish homes with a feast called the Seder. In many Reform and Humanistic Jewish homes, the Seder is held only on the first night.

The word seder literally means "order" of the service. It is a ceremonial diner marked by the retelling of the exodus through the use of prayers, songs and ceremonial doods — including matzah.
